

## **Snowmobile Safety is** a Must this Winter

Tafe, responsible riding is actively Supported and promoted by organized snowmobiling. Snowmobile safety trainers have been conducting snowmobile safety classes for decades in the United States and Canada, and in 1995, the community embraced the Safe Riders! You Make Snowmobiling Safe© safety campaign—the guidepost for safe snowmobiling behavior.

Sponsored by the International Snowmobile Manufacturers Association (ISMA), the Safe Riders! campaign highlights that individual behavior and responsibility is the key to making snowmobiling safe. Snowmobilers understand that snowmobiling is fun, but it is work too. It challenges the body and the mind and you need to be attentive while snowmobiling. Safe snowmobilers know their abilities and understand not to go beyond them.

Snowmobile safety begins with the machine, which is built to the highest standards. It is the responsibility of snowmobilers to keep their machine in top running condition following all of the recommended pre-ride checklists found in the owner's manual and making sure the vehicle is in top-notch shape before riding.

Snowmobilers also understand the need to dress appropriately while snowmobiling. Individuals must wear warm clothing, generally supplied through the snowmobile manufacturers and dealers. The clothing includes, dressing in layers with high quality jackets, bibbs, boots, gloves and a certified helmet.

Snowmobilers need to think ahead and prepare where they are going to ride. It is

best to file a plan with family or friends and let people where you are going to snowmobile. You need to be familiar with the riding area and or ride with individuals who have been there before.

Safe snowmobilers follow the key guidelines of the Safe Riders! campaign:

- Snowmobiling and alcohol don't mix don't drink and ride
- Ride safe, stay on the trail and respect private property
- One is the loneliest number. Never ride alone
- When riding on the trail, ride right and ride smart. Stay in Control
- · Smart Riders are

safe riders and they take snowmobile safety training/refresher courses.

- · Snowmobilers know before they go and always check local ice conditions
  - When night riding, safe riders slow down and expect the unexpected

Safe mountain riders know that avalanche safety training and awareness is of special importance. There are five key avalanche safety guidelines which should always be remembered when riding in the mountains:

- 1. Get the Gear: Ensure everyone has an avalanche transceiver, shovel and probe on their person and knows how to use them
- 2. Get the Training: Take an avalanche course which will highlight key issues.
- 3. Get the Forecast: Make a riding plan based on the current avalanche and weather forecast.
- 4. Get the Picture: If you see recent avalanche activity, unstable snow exists. Riding on or under slopes is dangerous.
- 5. Get Out of Harm's Way: One at a time on all avalanche slopes. Don't go to help your stuck friend, the extra weight could initiate an avalanche. Also, don't group up in runout zones or at the base of mountains.

The ISSA is joining the International Snowmobile Manufacturers Association (ISMA) in observance of Jan. 17-25 as International Snowmobile Safety Awareness Week. A safety proclamation has been requested from Iowa Gov. Terry Branstad, and club-related activities and safety classes are being encouraged at the local level.

"The purpose of International Snowmobile Safety Week is to expose people to safe snowmobiling practices and to demonstrate how operating safely can prevent mishaps," explained ISMA President Ed Klim. "Snowmobiling is a fun and exciting family activity enjoyed by over four million people across the United States and Canada. The sport is a safe and enjoyable form of recreation if done properly and with respect."

In Iowa, snowmobiles are operated by men, women and children of all ages. Depending on weather conditions, approximately 8,000 miles of snow-covered trails are maintained and groomed by snowmobile club volunteers across the state and enjoyed by a variety of winter recreationists.

Activities and events held during Snowmobile Safety Awareness Week will promote responsible attitudes and actions that will foster the safe, family image of snowmobiling.

"Safe Snowmobiling means riding within your own capabilities, operating at safe and appropriate speeds for the terrain and never drinking alcoholic beverages before or while driving," explained ISSA President Merv Hoermann. "Always wear a helmet and adequate clothing, stay within designated riding areas and always snowmobile with another person, never alone.3

Occasionally, problems occur, and snowmobilers should be prepared for all possible scenarios.

"Take along a spare belt, spark plugs and tools to do basic repairs. You also should carry emergency supplies, such as a basic first aid kit, and overnight survival provisions, such as food, matches, flashlight and extra batteries, and shelter building materials," Hoermann recommended. "Most importantly, always use common sense and keep a clear head. Learn all you can about responsible snowmobiling and keep safety as your top priority."

Hoermann said the ISSA is encouraging its member-clubs to sponsor youth snowmobile safety courses and to host other safetyrelated activities. Ideas and suggestions are available online through ISMA's Campaign Action Manual at www.snowmobile.org. Also posted there is information on ISMA's Safe Riders! program.

Materials that are available from both programs include the following: posters, fact books, a safety video, public service announcements, a website and decals that highlight safety messages and enhance safety education efforts.

"We hope that you will find this web-based information useful in your organization's snowmobile safety campaign," Klim said. "The suggested activities contained there can be modified to meet your club's needs. Any suggestions or ways to improve this manual are welcome. Have a great snowmobile season!"

# **New Regulations for Youth Riders Take Effect this Winter**

hanks to legislation supported by the ISSA, the Iowa Department of Natural Resources has been able to relax some of

its requirements for youths riding snowmobiles on public trails this winter.

Effective this past July when signed by Gov. Terry Branstad, the language parallels the regulations for the state's ATV program and, according to then-ISSA President Jim Willey, makes it more family friendly.

The new law allows youth under the age of 16 to operate their own snowmobile on state snowmobile trails and public property when under the supervision of an adult.

"Families will be able to ride snowmobiles together on Iowa trails legally for the first time with everyone driving their own sled," Willey noted. "This means a five-year-old without a safety certificate can ride on a 120 on a public trail with a parent supervising on a full-size sled. The 120 will have to have a valid Iowa snowmobile registration and a trail pass, however."

The law remains unchanged for youths aged 12 to 17 years who need to have completed the IDNR's youth safety course to operate their sled on state trails and public property, clarified IDNR Snowmobile Program Manager David Downing.

"Operators under 12 years of age do not have to have an education certificate. This is similar to how we treat youth hunters under the age of 12, hunting under the supervision of a responsible licensed

adult," Downing further explained. "Choosing the size of the snowmobile for a minor operator is the decision of the parent or guardian. There is no legal requirement."

Here are the rules governing youth operation of a snowmobile:

- Persons under the age of 16 may operate their own snowmobile under the direct supervision of a responsible person of at least 18 years of age experienced in snowmobile operation who possesses a valid driver's license or an education certificate issued or recognized by the DNR.
- Persons 12 through 17 must have a valid snowmobile education certificate in their possession when operating.
- Persons 16 to 17 may operate unsupervised, but must have a valid education certificate. Restrictions on operating a motor vehicle also

apply to persons in this age group.

• Persons 18 and older may operate without an education certificate if their privilege to operate a motor vehicle has not been barred or revoked.

he ISSA Board of Directors has renewed its contract with Mike Heller and Paula Feltner to serve as the organization's lobbying team at the State Capitol in Des Moines for 2015.

This January will mark the 12th legislative session the lawyers will be working on behalf of snowmobiling interests in Iowa. They were first hired in November of 2003 for \$17,500 per year. Next year's contract will be worth \$23,000.

"We really appreciate the opportunity to represent you," Heller said at the October ISSA Board of Directors meeting. "It has been an interesting ride for us, and I do think you should be commended because, whether you realize it or not, you are one of the most successful legislative groups in the state.'

The need for a full-time lobbyist dates back to May of 2002, when the Iowa Legislature de-appropriated nearly \$1 million in snowmobile registration fees. Nobody was minding the till back then, and lawmakers found the off-season stockpile easy pickings for their budget shortfalls.

The snowmobile funds were eventually reimbursed, thanks to the hard work of the ISSA and its Emergency Funding Committee, which still oversees the organization's lobbying efforts.

"There's absolutely no way we could get along without our lobbyists," Past ISSA President and charter EFC member Bruno Andreini said. "We would have never accomplished what we have done without them."

"One of the things I never thought we would accomplish when we first started representing you was getting that money restored to the fund, but we did it," Heller said. "That happened because of all of the hard work from you guys and your constituency. You

were very persistent, and you didn't take no for an answer.

In addition to restoring the robbed snowmobile funds, the lobbyists—along with the grassroots efforts of ISSA members have worked to increase snowmobile registration fees, moved to an annual registration system and implemented a trail permit program, with all the proceeds benefitting snowmobile trails in Iowa.

"Another example of your diligence was the registration fee increase," Heller said. "Take a look at that. If you go back over

the last few yearscompare it to hunting fees, compare it to fishing license fees, compare it to anything else-the climate has not been very condusive to any kind of fee increase over the last 10

"We want to thank you for your efforts and we're proud to be a part of it," he continued. "It's been interesting. If you would have asked us, we would have told you that a lot of those things were probably not going to happen. But you didn't ask us. You told us what to do."

One legislative hurdle the lobbyists and the ISSA have not been able to clear is securing state gas tax reimbursement on the fuel used in snowmobiles. This effort has been ongoing throughout the lobbyists' tenure with the ISSA and will doubtfully gain any traction in the future.

Heller, instead, recommends that the organization now pursue the sales tax paid on snowmobiles. Past ISSA President and EFC member Terry Durby agreed.

"That's where the bulk of the money is available in the general fund moreso than through gas tax," he pointed out.

"We should be trying for that every opportunity we can," then-ISSA President Jim Willey said.

While the gas tax initiative has stalled, Willey was still pleased with the legislative successes last season, including the DNR "clean-up bill" which relaxed youth snowmobile age requirements and made it easier to register vintage snowmobiles.

"Vintage registration is huge to a lot of our members," Willey said. "They are becoming more and more popular all the time, but it was becoming virtually impossible to get a sled registered which hadn't been recently registered. Mike and Paula worked to get the wording right and partnered with the Iowa Department of Natural Resources (IDNR) to get that done."

Reflecting gradual cost-of-living increases over the last decade, the lobbying fees are paid directly out of the ISSA General Fund. and any grant money the EFC receives from the IDNR cannot be earmarked for legislative initiatives. Instead, the ISSA relies on its Club Challenge to help offset the lobbyist price tag.

Last year, ISSA-member clubs raised \$7,253 through donations to the Club Challenge, and thanks to checks turned in at the ISSA Annual Convention last month, more than \$4,000 has been raised for the 2015 lobbying expense so far this year.

# Iowa Snowmobilers Donate \$6,000 to ACSA Legal Defense Fund

S nowmobilers in Iowa have donated more than \$6,000 to the American Council of Snowmobile Association's (ACSA) Legal Defense Fund since a renewed fundraising campaign began statewide in August of 2013.

Over the course of the past15 months, ISSA-member clubs have kicked in \$3,200, and late last month, the ISSA fulfilled its part of the challenge with a match of \$3,000 from the proceeds of its hosting of the International Snowmobile Congress in 2010.

"We may be considered a marginal snow state, but we certainly are not marginal in our enthusiasm for snowmobiling and what we are willing to do to support our sport," said Past ISSA President Jim Willey at the 2014 ISSA Convention in Dubuque in November.

The purpose of the donations is to help finance legal battles over snowmobile access to public lands. While Yellowstone National Park normally catches the headlines in this arena, the most recent wrangling stems from a lawsuit brought by the Winter Wildlands Alliance (WWA), a cross-country ski group which alleges that snowmobiles were not being managed by the U.S. Forest Service in Idaho.

"The recent court ruling in Idaho threatens snowmobile trails in every national forest," ACSA Executive Director Christine Jourdain explained. "This ruling will be very expensive to challenge, but ACSA is committed to fight along with others for your access to public lands."

According to Jourdain, ACSA, the Idaho State Snowmobile Association and the International Snowmobile Manufacturers Association have been defending this snowobile access since April of 2013 and have cumulatively paid in excess of \$120,000 in attorney fees.

A draft rule was released this past summer, and a final rule is expected in January. "We are optimistic that the final rule will be one the snowmobile community can comply with, and that it satisfies the WWA's concern over snowmobile management," Jourdain said in her November update to members.

In August of 2013, Past ISSA and ACSA President Terry Durby urged the ISSA Board of Directors to help fund this fight and to keep pace with donations from their counterparts in South Dakota, Minnesota, Wisconsin and Washington.

"These court challenges seem to be lining up against us right now," Durby said at the time. "They will affect Iowans' ability to ride elsewhere. Those areas are all dependent on continuing the fight, and that fight takes money."

By October this year, ACSA had spent \$37,500 on legal fees in this battle and had depleted its Legal Defense fund to just \$2,600. Alarmed by this, Willey immediately issued 'A Call to Action' to Iowa snowmobile clubs to drum up donations for the cause.

"This is an ongoing battle which snowmobilers cannot afford to lose," Willey said. "If this battle is lost, snowmobiling access on all federal land is endangered. Even if you never ride in any of the other states who are lucky enough to have federal land, access to all public land could be lost if this precedent is set."

Following Willey's plea, the Chickasaw Sno-Riders of Region 4 was the first club to step up with a \$100 donation. Its club members also issued a challenge for other clubs in the state to match their donation, resulting in eight additional clubs following their lead this fall.

The generosity continued at last month's convention. Another \$500 was raised through the spontaneous donation of a Colorado vacation package, and Past ISSA President Dale Vagts of V&V Insurance, Cresco, issued a check for another \$200, urging clubs and businesses to match his donation.

"This is a much-needed fund," Vagts told convention-goers. "We need all the help we can get. And I challenge all clubs and businesses to match or beat that amount."

# Hoermann becomes first multi-term president; Willey follows in father's footsteps

Tistoy was made last month in the organized snowmobile **L**community of Iowa when Merv Hoermann of Sutherland became the first multi-term president of the ISSA following elections at the 2014 Annual Convention in Dubuque.

Hoermann, who served as ISSA president from 2006-08, was reelected to another term after serving a year as vice president under outgoing President Jim Willey. Hoermann was elected to the VP post in November of 2013 to fill the vacancy created by the sudden resignation of Thayne Lowman.

"We are very pleased, Merv, that you have agreed to step up and serve again for the ISSA," Willey said Saturday evening, Nov. 22, at the convention banquet.

"I want to thank everybody for their support and I will give the best I have for the next two years," Hoermann vowed. "This is not a one-man show. I am the kind of guy who likes to work with other people, and I hope all of you will work with me over the next two

ISSA resident historian Dick Melick confirmed this is the first time in the 41-year history of the ISSA that a past president has been re-elected to another term. Melick, a past president himself, admired Hoermann's commitment to the organization.

"ISSA officers serve as volunteers and receive no compensation other than 'out of pocket' expenses incurred in fulfilling the duties of the office," he pointed out. "It takes a person who is fully committed to the ISSA to step into such positions which require a major dedication of time and money. With Merv agreeing to take the office again, it indicates his full commitment to the association and snowmobiling in Iowa."

After his first term ended in 2008, Hoermann has remained active in the ISSA. He has served on several committees and represents snowmobilers on the Iowa Department of Transportation's Recreational Trails Advisory Board. He also participates on the Western Iowa Tourism Region board.

"I've made a lot of relationships with a lot of people outside of the ISSA, especially with tourism," he said after the convention. "They just don't shun away from me when I show up because I represent motorized. I'm making some friends in non-motorized areas, and I think that's a big, big plus for our organization."

Hoermann feels his leadership experience will benefit the ISSA, and that's one of the reasons he decided to step up at the Altoona convention last year. Anyone other than a former past president would have had only one year in office before expecting to take

Hoermann acknowledged the progress the organization has made over the last six years, and he is not looking to perform any course correction. Instead, he wants to keep "our membership excited about what we are planning to do."

At the December ISSA Board of Directors meeting, Hoermann

plans to set his agenda for the next two years and will accept feedback from board members on what they want to accomplish legislatively and otherwise.

"There have been a lot of changes since I last served," he said. "We haven't been sitting on our hands, and we have accomplished a lot. From that, it took a lot of work from the clubs, especially legislatively. I'm not going to go in there and demand we do this or that. I want it to be a collective goal."

## **Great turnout**

Thirty-two of the state's 61 snowmobile clubs were represented at this year's convention, and the final tally for convention registrations was 280, the largest turnout since the late 1980s.

In addition to hospitality Friday night and elections and general membership meeting Saturday morning, the convention featured Saturday afternoon seminars and the Saturday evening awards banquet.

Bret Rasmussen of Idaho was the featured speaker Saturday night and presented a slideshow on his life in moutain riding. Rasmussen is a backcountry snowmobiling expert and promotes his Ride Rasmussen Style through clinics and seminars.

According to his website, Rasmussen teaches skills on location to snowmobile groups around the country and Canada such as riding groups, dealership groups, corporate retreats, search and rescue groups, military, as well as individuals and many others.

"We want riders to get off the trail, challenge themselves and explore the backcountry in a safe manner," Rasmussen explained during his convention presentation. "Prior to our techniques, the trails out west all went uphill and downhill, and a lot of times people would find themselves at the bottom of a ravine or at the bottom of a gully and they would have to spend the night because they couldn't get back out."

Rasmussen described his technique as a style that allows riders to get into the backcountry and do things and go places "with control" that most riders have been unable to do before.

"Most non-sledders do not think that snowmobiling is not athletic and that all we do is go out for a joy ride," he said. "Out in the mountains, snowmobiling is very athletic, very tiring so why is it fun? Because it's a challenge. That's the reason."

### Meat and potatoes

The annual awards ceremony followed Rasmussen's presentation, and the award winners will be featured in the January issue of this

Earlier in the day, fellow backcountry expert Julie-Ann Chapman of British Columbia led a seminar on women in snowmobiling and cold-weather survival. Her convention offerings were among 10 informative seminars available that weekend.

Other seminars featured motivational speaker Dee Dee Raap of Sioux Falls and vintage sled restoration by the Antique Snowmobile Club of America.

High Octane Productions offered tips on recording and editing snowmobile action video, and the ISSA Awards Committee provided instruction and insight on the club recognition and awards program.

"I thought the convention went extremely well," Willey said.

"We had great attendance, and I heard great things about the entire weekend, including our seminars."

As part of its triannual rotation, next year's convention returns to western Iowa. Regions 1 and 2 will be coordinating the event Nov. 20-22 at King's Pointe Resort in Storm Lake, the host site of the 2010 convention. Plans are also in the works for a separate snow show at Dubuque next October.

how it may appear, Chris said his election as VP last month was not scripted.

"This was not the plan at all. I wanted to continue on as region director and groomer director and was not planning on being elected vice president," he said.

Still, when the 35-year-old is elected president in two years, he will become one of the youngest leaders of the ISSA in its history, and he and his father will become the first father-son duo to lead the association, a fact that was not lost on his dad.

Including Secretary Sue Paulus and Treasurer Kim Herman, incumbents remained in office for Regions 2, 4 and 6. Craig Smith has replaced Ron Sienknecht as director for Region 8 and Bob Scott has stepped down as Region 12 director.


