Groomer Operator Certification Due by End of Month

 Γ ive groomer operators, including two new volunteers, earned their Iowa State Snow-mobile Trail Grant Program Review and Selection Committee (RSC) Groomer Operator Certification at the 2019 ISSA Annual Convention in Burlington Nov. 23. Their cards are now good for five years.

All groomer operators need to be certified or re-certified by the first of the year. The first half of each club's alphabetical operator roster was due last Jan. 1, and the second half is due at the end of this month, although most have already been through the training, officials reported.














ISSA Memberships Show Slight Increase in 2019

Declining membership in the ISSA finally tapered off in 2019 as the organization reported a membership gain for the first time in nine consecutive years. Last season ended with 2,028 paid memberships, up slightly from 2018's total of 1,979.

ISSA Membership Chair Brittany Paulus released these figures for the ISSA General Membership Meeting at the 2019 ISSA Annual Convention in Burlington Nov. 23. Region 5 showed the most paid memberships at 426. More than a quarter of those members belonged to the Cresco Driftrunners, which—at 118 members—makes them the largest club in the state.

The next highest club totals were reported for the Iowa Snowdrifters in Region 9 with 87 ISSA memberships and the Dickinson County Snowhawks in Region 1 with 83 paid members. Regions 10 and 6 showed the lowest totals at 25 and 13, respectively. Each of these regions only had one club with ISSA memberships.

In the report handed out at convention, the ISSA recognized 60 clubs in Iowa. Those reporting 100 percent membership in the ISSA are listed in the Club Directory toward the back of this magazine. According to the membership report, seven clubs did not show any ISSA members. One of those clubs has since dissolved.

Membership in the ISSA typically follows the same trend as snowfall totals for Iowa. Memberships increase as riding conditions improve. In 2011, following two above-average snowmobile seasons, memberships in the ISSA reached a high of 2,936 members. With five of the next eight years failing to hit the state's 31-inch snow-

fall average, memberships suffered.

Since 2012, the ISSA has lost a net 832 members. With dues at \$15 per member/family, this drop represents a reduction of \$12,480 in revenue for the ISSA, making it



financially tough to continue many of its programs. At the local level, memberships for many clubs across the state

have dropped in half if not more, and some of the recruiting struggles are occasionally documented in the Club News each month.

"Snowmobiling for many in Iowa is no longer a lifestyle. It's just something to do when it snows outside," Past ISSA President Chris Willey acknowledged at convention. "Everybody is just really busy in their lives anymore."

The ISSA Board of Directors has also felt the pinch. Attendance at board meetings has dropped, and a summer campout has not been held in two years, although a fall effort in 2018 was rained out and not rescheduled. Bids to host the ISSA annual convention have also been accepted out of rotation to ensure a convention site.

In an effort to improve attendance, board meetings were reduced from a traditional 10 times annually to every other month. Three years ago, the ISSA consolidated the bottom tier of regions into one large Region 10 and part of Region 12's clubs were absorbed by Region 9. The realignment was designed to increase the chances for a quorum; yet some meetings since have failed to produce one.

"We need to get back to how we were operating before," **turn to page 8**

Snowmobile Iowa Dates Still Available this Winter

Three of the seven dates for the 2020 Snowmobile Iowa club ride schedule were confirmed during a Nov. 23 planning session at the 2019 ISSA Annual Convention in Burlington. Beginning with the second weekend in January, three clubs volunteered to host a trail ride every other Saturday:

- Jan. 18 from Rock Falls to Clarksville. Co-hosted by the North Iowa Snow Seekers/Floyd County Groomers/Butler County Snow Snoops. For more information, contact Seth at (641) 512-1932.
- Feb. 1 at the trailhead in Slater. Hosted by the Saylorville Dam Snowmobile Club. For more information, contact Barry at (515) 240-5444.
- Feb. 15 at Mount Pleasant. Hosted by the Southeast Iowa Ridge-Blasters. For more information, contact Aaron at (319) 217-6361.

A spin-off of the Snowmobile Iowa club displays at convention each year, this IS-SA-sponsored trail ride program was conceived three years ago "to educate snowmobile riders about the best trail locations in Iowa," according to ride coordinator and Past ISSA President Bruno Andreini.

"This winter will be our fourth attempt

to host rides across Iowa," Andreini said. "I really believe in this program, but we've definitely suffered from a lack of snow over the years. You have to have snow and have it in the right place at the right time



to be successful. definitely willing to try it again this year."

Andreini pointed out planning snowmobile

rides in Iowa further strengthens the sport's economic impact locally. Riding closer to home means participants spend less time trailering out of state. This reduces their travel expenses, thus "helping Iowa by keeping our dollars here," he said.

To host a ride, a club must provide a guide—or "ride captain," as Andreini calls it—to lead the group along established routes on his or her trail system. The club should designate trailhead parking, supply trail maps to participants and offer lodging information. Designated stops should be planned throughout the day.

"I would like to see as many board members participate in these rides as possible," he said. "We want to promote our sport and our opportunities to turn to page 8



Pretty fitting the 2019 ISSA Annual Convention was held at a casino resort in November. When convention planning committee chair Aaron Dorothy suggested in August it could snow in southeast Iowa three months later, the odds his half-hearted wager would cash in were slim at best.

Yet, when attendees awoke Saturday morning, Nov. 23, an overnight dusting had covered the sleds on display on the grounds of the Pzazz Convention Center and Catfish Bend Casino in Burlington. Needless to say, Dorothy, the ISSA's director for Region 10, was feeling lucky and brimming with confidence.

"So, for the skeptics out there who say it doesn't snow in southeast Iowa, here's your proof," joked Dorothy, who also serves as president of the Southeast Iowa Ridge-Blasters, the host club for

last month's convention. "That's how good of a convention we put on this year. We scheduled some snow, and it arrived on time."

Although the snowcover was short-lived, Dorothy's gamble to host the convention in the far southeast corner of the state seemed to pay off a little better. Despite the extended travel time for most attendees, the venue still drew close to 125 ISSA members and their families—a total exceeding some attendance figures from past conventions further north.

"I think we did good for being in southeast Iowa," Ridge-Blasters member Luke Fuller

said. "We know we're located in a marginal snow area, but it did snow this morning so that was good sign. Most of the long-time ISSA members I've talked to seemed happy with our convention and the facilities."

Following ISSA guidelines, this year's convention was supposed to be held in the central part of Iowa as part of a threeyear rotation across the state to improve attendance. So when a bid failed to materialize a year ago, Dorothy's club stepped up to host the annual gathering in eastern Iowa.

"I thought everything went fairly well this weekend," Dorothy said. "There were a few hiccups along the way, but we've been dealing with them as they come up. It's been fun but stressful. I hope everybody had fun. I guess I was most concerned about everyone having a good time."



The party started Friday night with hospitality and live music from a local country western band. The following morning was the ISSA's General Membership Meeting with region elections in the odd-numbered regions as 2019 is an odd-numbered year.

In Region 1, director Dan Delperdang stepped down, and assistant Jim Skinner was named director. At the ISSA Board of Directors meeting Sunday morning, the board accepted three resignations in Region 8 and two in Region 9. Geo Prescott and Jamie Prull were approved as the directors in those two regions, respectively.

ISSA leadership did not change convention weekend. President Brian Carmichael, Vice President Scott Nauman, Secretary Sue Paulus and Treasurer Brittany Paulus remain in office for another year. Next fall, the ISSA will be searching for a new vice president, though, as Carmichael completes his two-year term and Nauman is expected to succeed him.

Also approved by the board Sunday morning, the 2020 convention will be hosted by the Saylorville Dam Snowmobile Club of Region 7 in Ames Nov. 13-15, as the central and eastern regions flip-flopped positions on the host schedule. The convention site for the ISSA's 48th anniversary will be back on rotation in western Iowa in 2021.

Club donations

Back to this year's convention, the rest of Saturday was filled with guest speakers, seminars, a groomer certification course, program updates, on-site activities, scholarship presentations and the annual awards banquet, most of which will be covered in this and later issues of the Iowa Snowmobiler magazine.

Dorothy said he wanted to plan a convention for the entire fam-

ily. Fourteen ladies enjoyed a 'Wine and Unwind' wreath-making and wine-tasting event in the afternoon opposite the meetings and seminars; while 17 youths participated in activities throughout the day, including a 'Trail Readiness' course and go-cart racing in the adjacent Fun City center.

"Having that many kids at convention was definitely a step in the right direction," said Dorothy, who also oversees the ISSA's Youth Program. "We wanted to focus on the youth this year, and I think we accomplished that."

The trail class was led by Dorothy's sons, Kevin and Jared, and their cousin, Koen Dorothy. According to their dad and uncle, the boys wanted "to go through and explain some of the more important things to think about before heading out on a snowmobile and things to do to your sled as you wait for snow. It was their idea to host the class."

Complete with a slide presentation and various sled parts, the youth training was made possible by sponsor V&V Insurance. The Fun City passes and 'Youth Social' was financed by the Iowa Snowdrifters of Region 9. They were among 17 clubs and ISSA friends who kicked in \$4,100 to help cover convention expenses. See the entire list below right.

Dorothy said he was appreciative of everyone's donations and will present a formal convention report at the January board meeting. "I think we are going to be alright," he told the board Sunday morning. "We had many clubs step up and contribute, and I thanked them many, many times for helping out. They made everything possible."

As a tradition during convention weekend, ISSA clubs also presented checks to support ISSA charities and programs. More than \$10,000 in donations was turned in at the banquet Saturday night

(see page 19), and more than \$3,000 was raised through the Silent Auction and various raffles inside the banquet hall.

Disappointing snow show

About the only letdown of the weekend was the planned Snow Show. The Ridge-Blasters said they struggled to get interest from area snowmobile dealers and vendors, so the room next to the banquet hall served as home to Snowmobile Iowa club displays and a few other booths, including Track, Inc., the Polaris Ride Command trail app and the Spina Bifida Association of Iowa, the ISSA's official charity.

"We were lacking some of the big vendors for our snow show, which was disappointing," Fuller acknowledged. "We even talked to some we do business with personally to get them here, but we were told we were just too far south."

Still, Dorothy said he was encouraged by the turnout last month and was grateful for the advice and support he received from Delperdang, who served as last year's convention planning committee chair in Okoboji. Dorothy said he will return the favor when Region 7 Director John Kahler helps with next year's convention.

"I will take what we've learned over the past two years and pass it on," Dorothy promised.

Snow Snoops Keep Chugging Along

During a period when the ISSA and many of its member-clubs experienced declining memberships, the Butler County Snow Snoops saw significant growth over the last four years. The Region 4 club is now the sixth largest club in the state.

Starting with a low of 26 members in 2016, the club added 19 members in 2017 and 18 more in 2018 before ending last season with 74 total members. According to club president Seth Bram, remaining active throughout the year has been key to member recruitment and retention.

"That's been sort of our business model," said Bram, who also serves as the ISSA's Region 4 Director. "Our club is doing a lot more things outside of snowmobiling that keeps everybody's interest level up. I guess you could say we've been bucking the trend."

When they are not riding and maintaining 180 miles of snow-mobile trail, the Snow Snoops keep their name out there during the off-season with regular meetings, a groomer display at the Butler County Fair and keeping a stretch of road litter-free through the Adopt-A-Highway program.

They also support their sponsors with a fall Car Cruise that welcomes UTVs and motorcycles, and later this month, they plan

to make the rounds with a Party Bus Dec. 14. But by far, the club's biggest offseason attraction is its fourperson golf tournament at the Round Grove Golf Course in Greene.

This past July, 19 teams competed in the second annual event, helping the club raise funds for its cost-share of a new or updated groomer.

According to Bram, the club is "halfway" to its fundraising goal and is currently sixth on the waiting list for a new machine from the Iowa State Snowmobile Trail Grant Program.

If the club wants a new groomer, members will need to pony up 25 percent of the cost. A used one won't be as expensive, according to the program's Review and Selection Committee guidelines. The Snow Snoops have requested a new groomer the last three years on

their trail grant application.

Until that wish is fulfilled, the club will continue to operate—and repair—its 2002 Tucker Terra 1000. Of significant note, that unit was one of the first groomers in Iowa to be purchased with federal grant money from the Recreational Trails Program, a funding stream the ISSA still leans on for updated equipment.

Most of the Snow Snoops' trail system is cross-country and fea-

tures both sides of the Shell Rock River bottom between Greene and Clarksville. As detailed on the map in this month's center spread, the club also serves the communities of Allison, Aplington, Aredale, Dumont, New Hartford, Parkersburg and Shell Rock.

Part of their trail system creeps into Floyd County on the north with a 15-mile

stretch leading to Nashua. They also connect to neighboring systems for access to Plainfield, Waverly, Marble Rock, Rockwell, Floyd, Charles City and beyond. Last season, club volunteers groomed 1,400 miles with their Tucker.

This winter, the club hopes to showcase its trail system with its third annual Vintage Ride in February and by co-hosting a Snowmobile Iowa event in January. For the fourth year in a row, the Jan. 18 ride—weather permitting—will basically follow the Shell Rock River from Rock Falls on the north to Clarksville on the south.

The Snow Snoops will coordinate the 60-mile snowmobile ride with the North Iowa Snow Seekers and the Floyd County Groomers. Participation in this ISSA-sponsored event is just one of the ways the Snow Snoops support the state organization.

In addition to Bram serving on the ISSA Board of Directors, the club is a Platinum Sponsor and 100 percent ISSA, meaning its \$25 single/\$30 family dues include membership in the ISSA. In 2017, the club hosted the ISSA Summer Campout and, in 2018, was named the ISSA's Snowmobile Club of the Year.

Clear Lake's Jack Race renamed Midwest Sled Fest as Charter Organizers 'Retire'

fter resorting to the February backup date three of the last five seasons, new organizers of the annual vintage LeMans snowmobile races on Clear Lake are breaking from tradition this winter and forgoing a reserve date. Instead of the third weekend in January, they are planning their event for Feb. 8 with no back-up date set.

"It's not fair for the participants to expect one date and then have it changed later on—even as late as the weekend before," said new race coordinator Rusty Peters of the North Iowa Snow Seekers of Region 3. "We are going with just one date this year, and if the weather doesn't cooperate, we will try again next season."

The race planning committee was mindful of other events in the area and across the state when choosing the new date, including the Winter Dance Party at Clear Lake the weekend before and the University of Okoboji Winter Games in Region 1 and the Cresco Driftrunners' Snow Fest in Region 5, both set for the last weekend in January.

Going forward, the race weekend will be known as the Midwest Sled Fest. For the previous 10 years, the event was billed as the Jack Helgren Memorial Race Iowa LeMans Championship, a two-day event named for a Mason City snowmobile dealer who helped promote the sport of snowmobiling in North Iowa for more than 40 years.

Past ISSA President Gary McVicker, a Helgren family friend, spearheaded the first race in 2009 and witnessed the event grow each year. A throwback to racing on Clear Lake in the 1970s, the vintage LeMans races featured classes for snowmobile age and engine size with prize money reaching \$10,000 last winter. Other attractions each year included youth racing, radar runs and vintage snowmobile shows.

"It has been a great thing to see the old-fashioned racing and snowmobiling that Jack loved return to the area," Gary and his wife Karen McVicker said. "And we were so happy to see the appreciation for the vintage sleds and also the racing being passed on to the younger generation that attended the events over the years.'

Otherwise known as the Jack Race, the competition drew thousands of spectators and competitors from across the Midwest. The races were initially held at McIntosh State Park near Ventura the first two years. The next winter, they were relocated in front of the Sea Wall near downtown Clear Lake before finding a permanent home on the south shore in front of Clear Lake State Park.

This past summer, the charter members of the Jack Race committee informed the rest of the group of their intentions to "retire." The plans were made public earlier this fall in a post on Facebook, and the announcement was picked up various media, including the Associated Press, a testament to the widespread appeal of the north central Iowa winter competition.

"After a couple meetings, emails, phone calls, etc., the decision has been made to dissolve the Jack Race as it has been known for the past 10 years," the McVickers explained. "Ten years was a good run. We have had a lot of fun, loved getting to know everyone and seen our hard work pay off 10 times!! Your support made it successful, and we appreciate the part each of you played in making it happen."

Over the years, several local snowmobile clubs have volunteered at The Jack, but at its core were members from the North Iowa Snow Seekers (official race sponsor), Hancock County Snowmobile Association and the Iowa River Riders. The remaining financial proceeds from the event were divided among the three groups, and leftover race equipment was retained by the Snow Seekers for future events at Clear Lake.

Organizers of the new Midwest Sled Fest are planning to hold many of the same events as previous years and have started a Facebook page to post race updates. Sponsors are currently being sought for the 2020 races. For more information or to donate, contact Peters at (641) 420-0248.
