

During the November meeting, it was brought to the board's attention that a few of the legislators have been asking about the bill that did not make it through last spring that would combine the registration and trail pass into one sticker for residents and leave the existing trail pass in place for non-residents. It was decided as a board to give this legislation one last push this year as we feel that the only thing that stood in our way last spring was the CO-VID pandemic. Any legislation that was non-essential to the operation of the State was not voted on. So, please keep a close eye on all of ISSA's upcoming communications for further information on how we will proceed. Unconventional Decision

Pandemic Shuts Down Ames Event Just Days Before Start

Three weeks after the ISSA Board of Directors decided to officially move forward with the annual state snowmobile convention, Iowa Gov. Kim Reynolds imposed new public health measures intended to reduce the growing spread of the corona-



virus in Iowa. The pandemic's untimely ultimately surge forced the ISSA to change its course.

governor's The Nov. 10 proclamation came just three days before the con-

vention was scheduled to begin in Ames; and while groups larger than 25 people could still meet indoors under social-distancing and face-covering mandates, the ISSA Convention Planning Committee erred on the side of caution and decided to cancel the upcoming three-day weekend.

"This decision has not been an easy one to make, but due to the demographic of our membership and the rising number of CO-VID cases in Iowa, I feel this is the prudent choice to make at this time," committee chair and Region 7 Director John Kahler announced by email shortly after the governor's press conference.

The timing of the previous week's chain of events was still stinging Sunday morning, Nov. 15, when the ISSA board met virtually for its regularly scheduled monthly meeting. "I would much rather be sitting

in a hotel in Ames right now for this meeting, but the way this COVID thing is going, cancelling our convention was the proper thing to do," Kahler acknowledged.

Kahler and his committee of snowmobile club members from Region 7 spent several months working with the host hotel and lining up vendors, caterers, speakers and entertainment. In less than a day, those involved were notified the event was called off indefinitely. "Everyone was totally understanding, and most were not surprised by the decision," Kahler said.

Expenses incurred

According to Kahler, 66 ISSA members had pre-registered and pre-paid their convention fees. Those registrants have since been asked to email him at jfkahler@hotmail.com to request their money back or to destroy their checks if their money had not already been previously deposited.

"Only those who request refunds will get their money back," Kahler said. "Otherwise, those funds should stay in the convention account because that's what it was meant for."

To this point, the ISSA is on the hook for half of its \$500 deposit with the Quality Inn and Suites Conference Center and another \$250 for liability insurance. By the afternoon of Nov. 11, the host hotel had released all reservations for convention attendees. "Most everything else, we were able to cancel without penalty as well," Kahler said.

In addition to non-refunded registration fees, any donations and sponsorship money will also be retained in the ISSA convention account for the next attempt at a convention—presumably in the fall of 2021 although there was some discussion at the board meeting of having a spring event at the same hotel.

"Everyone we talked to said they would be willing to come back at a later date if a vaccine is found or restrictions were lifted," Kahler noted.

To date, a bid to host the 2021 convention has not been submitted to the board. Following a three-year rotation, clubs in western Iowa are responsible for hosting next year's event, but none had stepped forward by the October deadline. Recognizing the effort put in for this year's cancelled convention, the board invited Kahler and his team to host again in 2021. He said he will reach out to his group and return an answer to the board at a later date.

Raffle extended

Based on their experience organizing this year's event, Kahler said the chances of stepping forward to host again were above average. "We had a lot of good donations from equipment manufacturers and others alike, and I have a lot of swag in my living room right now that I'll need to get rid of eventually," he said.

The funds generated by donations for the award winners will be applied to the costs of the plaques and the expenses related to delivering awards to their recipients. In lieu of the cancelled Awards Banquet at convention, ISSA officials are expected to make local presentations to the award winners on behalf of the ISSA Awards Committee

The ISSA board also extended the drawing date for the ISSA Grand Raffle, previously planned for convention weekend. That drawing will now be held Jan. 30, allowing Region Directors more time to sell additional tickets for the \$500 cash prize. According to Raffle Committee Chair Seth Bram, most raffle tickets are historically sold in person at convention, so this extension will make up for that missed oppor-

Another casualty from the voided convention was club donations to the various charities and causes recognized by the ISSA, as listed on page 5 of this month's issue. Clubs are now being asked to send their checks to the ISSA office at 1924 270th Street, Marble Rock, IA 50653. The fundraising year renews annually at state convention.

Board elections

The final order of business for the ISSA to tie up was board elections for 2020. Each year, the ISSA General Assembly meets at convention to determine leadership for the following year, including the offices of President, Vice President, Secretary and, in this year's case, Directors in even-numbered regions.

Following the Nov. 15 board meeting, ISSA President Brian Carmichael fulfilled his two-year term on the board. Per ISSA By-Laws, Vice President Scott Nauman automatically moves up one position, and he accepted his new role, becoming third straight second-generation president of the ISSA. Nauman's father, Dennis, served as president from 2001-02.

"Thank you for putting your trust in me to lead your organization," Carmichael said as board members thanked him for his time and service. "We had some difficult times. and we had some fun times as well. Last year was pretty rough with the pandemic. I hope you have a better time than I did, Scott."

"Don't worry. You're not going any-



where. I won't allow it," Nauman replied.

A new Vice President is now needed, and Kahler agreed to his nomination for that leadership position. Secretary Sue Paulus, who had previously intended to resign from her position after six years of service, decided to run for one more year. Kelsey Bram from the Butler County Snow Snoops of Region 4 was also nominated for the position of Secretary.

Incumbent Directors from Regions 2, 4, 8 and 10 also agreed to run again. In Region 6, Assistant Director Jamie Rohlf was nominated to serve. The entire ballot appears below and online at www.iowasnow-mobiler.com, the ISSA's official website. Write-ins are allowed, provided the candidate meets eligibility requirements.

Only current board members can be elected Vice President, while the Secretary and Director positions can be filled by the general membership. The Treasurer is appointed, and Brittany Paulus has agreed to remain in that role. Trying to navigate uncharted territory, the board then had to determine at its Nov. 15 meeting on how to proceed with voting.

Electronic voting

The ISSA's Standard Operating Procedures allow the business of the organization to be conducted electronically as needed, so collecting votes via email was adopted. Initially, the board voted to send ballots to only those members who had preregistered for the convention as they would presumably be the ones voting at the Saturday morning assembly.

The board later rescinded that motion following feedback from ISSA member Judy King of Council Bluffs. Without citing voter suppression by name, she urged the board to avoid "taking the easy way out" and to open the voting up to all current ISSA members.

"Is it fair that just because some members chose not to attend convention this year because of COVID that they can't vote and can't have a say on the leadership of their organization?" she questioned.

Her input swayed board members, who then voted to hold a special election Dec. 15. As required by ISSA By-Laws, a 30-day notice—along with voting instructions and the ballot—was posted on the ISSA's website on Nov. 15. Voting began immediately, and ballots can still be cast by emailing the ISSA's office at issa1257@yahoo. com. Voting ends at 11:59 p.m. CST on Dec. 15.

Only members in good standing with the ISSA are eligible to vote. Only one ballot per member, and the email signature must include the member's name, region and club (if applicable). The ISSA office will verify the member's eligibility. Any disqualified member vote will not be counted. If you have not already voted, please put '2020 ISSA Special Election' in the subject line and the candidate(s) of choice in the body of the email.

Members cannot vote for directors outside of their regions. The ISSA recognizes some members belong to multiple clubs, and those clubs may be in other regions. They should be voting for the region in which their home club is assigned and through which they pay their ISSA dues.

When made available, election results will be posted online and in the January issue of this publication.

In other election news, Todd Sieverding of Bellevue was re-elected to the ISSA's Review and Selection Committee (RSC) to serve another three-year term as the Eastern Iowa representative. Meeting the mid-October nomination deadline, he ran unopposed and was voted in by committee members. The RSC oversees the Iowa State Snowmobile Trail Grant Program.

House File 749 needs your help

'Grass-Roots' Effort Planned for Single-Sticker Legislation

Buoyed by a handful of legislative inquiries this fall, ISSA officials are mounting one last campaign to push the single-sticker bill across the finish line. If passed, the pro-snowmobiling legislation will permanently combine the registration and trail permit fees into one decal in Iowa.

The ISSA and its lobbyists, Mike Heller and Paula Feltner, have worked on this bill for four straight years. Formally known as House File 749, the legislation has twice passed the Iowa House unanimously and finally emerged from the Senate Ways and Means Committee this past March—only to be pushed aside after the coronavirus pandemic shut down the Statehouse in Des Moines for nearly three months.

When the Iowa Legislature reconvened in June, the bill was considered "non-essential" and perished. According to Past ISSA President Jim Willey, chair of the ISSA's Legislative Committee, legislators now consider the proposal "unfinished business" and are looking to revive the effort on behalf of snowmobilers in Iowa.

"We have been contacted by legislators willing to help us," Willey said. "It is important to note this bill would have passed last year had it not been for COVID-19."

Merging the \$15 trail pass and the \$15 registration fee is expected to generate \$75,000 in additional revenue annually for the Iowa State Snowmobile Trail Grant Program. Since 2017, this program has been controlled by the ISSA's Review and Selection Committee. This volunteer group earmarks 70 percent of the revenue from snowmobile registration fees and trail passes each year for trail maintenance and development.

Partial compliance

Since 2013, the trail permit has been required to ride on public trails, rights-of-way and frozen bodies of water in Iowa. Compliance has hovered around 60 percent among registered snowmobilers, so by combining the two stickers into one \$30 registration fee (plus writing costs), the trail pass would no longer be optional for the remaining third or so owners. If the proposed legislation passes, a non-resident trail pass would still remain in effect for



out-of-state riders.

Opposition to the bill normally arises from registered snowmobilers who claim they do not ride in Iowa and who therefore feel they should not have to pay for the additional \$15 trail pass. In the past, ISSA members have overwhelmingly endorsed the legislation, and they will once again be tasked with educating local riders and courting local politicians to support the measure.

"After four years of working on this bill, I will not be reaching out to legislators outside of my own home area," Willey said at the Nov. 15 ISSA Board of Directors meeting. "If you want this to happen, you will need to contact your clubs and reach out to your legislators yourselves. It's going to take effort from everyone on this board. We haven't provided enough pressure and haven't successfully sent a collective snowmobiling voice to Des Moines to make this work in the past."

"One negative call to a legislator resonates 10 times greater than one positive call," acknowledged Region 1 Assistant Director Randy Magg.

Limited lobbying resources

Complicating matters for the upcoming session is the ISSA's current budget situation. As of this writing, the ISSA has not renewed its contract with its lobbyists and will likely not commit any funds to their work outside of donations to the Club Challenge. Last year, this fundraising arm of the ISSA generated \$4,504 to cover lobbying expenses.

"We are going to have to coordinate this on our own," Willey said. "Our lobbyists have agreed to monitor activity for us in Des Moines and let us know when and where to act. Not being able to pay them in full at this point is obviously a blow to them. Without our lobbyists, I find this grass-roots effort very challenging. We will need to appeal to our clubs to get them to make calls and to send in donations.

"We are grateful that Mike and Paula will continue to work with us with the funds we have available through our Club Challenge," Willey continued. "They are committed to helping us get through this rough spot."



Training Cancelled for Youth, Groomer Operators

Rising coronavirus cases statewide in Iowa has led to the cancellation of all in-person, instructorled training for youth safety and groomer operators this season.

Rhonda Fowler, youth snowmobile safety coordinator for the Iowa Department of Natural Resources, is encouraging youths between the ages of 12 and 17 to complete their training online at www.SnowmobileCourse.com/USA/lowa.

"This is being done to reduce the exposure risk to students, volunteer instructors and their families due to COVID-19," Fowler explained.

Similarly, the Iowa State Snowmobile Trail Grant Program has cancelled all groomer training classes this winter and will be granting a one-year extension to those operators whose current training will expire at the end of December.

"If you have new operators needing to get certified, we will be looking at doing some smaller classes on an as-needed basis," explained Past ISSA President Chris Willey, program co-administrator and groomer training coordinator. "This option will be left up to the grooming instructors if they feel comfortable holding a class.

Clubs requesting extensions for their current operators need to email Willey at issa.rsc@gmail. com and include the following information: name, club, certificate expiration date and updated contact information.

"The instructor for your club's area will then review the list of requested extensions and sign off on them," Willey said. "Once completed, an updated list will be sent to your respective club email contact."

Four Openings Remain on ISSA Ride Schedule

The ISSA Board of Directors set time aside during its Nov. 15 regular monthly meeting to determine the dates for the Snowmobile lowa rides this coming winter. 
Grooming duties are shared among 15 certified operators. Two winters ago, volunteers built a wheeled packer to knock down weeds and build a base af-



As they have the previous four seasons, members of the Saylorville Dam Snowmobile Club of Region 7 are once again committing to host a Snowmobile Iowa ride this winter. After all, club member and Past ISSA President Bruno Andreini coordinates the statewide effort, so they may not have a choice.

This year, like previous pursuits, the club will invite riders from across Iowa to tour trails along the Heart of Iowa Nature Trail between Slater and Maxwell and also drop down to Big Creek State Park near Polk City. Both of these areas showcase multi-purpose trail systems and demonstrate the club's enduring relationships

with other trail users and managers.

Each year, club volunteers clear brush on the Heart of Iowa trail and reclaim a path through the woods at Big Creek. That sweeping effort was especially critical earlier this fall following the Aug. 10 derecho, which brought intense straightline winds to central Iowa. Fallen debris littered the trails everywhere.

Club president Barry Starmer said more than 30 volunteers, including members from the Clean Snowmobile Challenge team at Iowa State University, showed up over several weekends to clean up the mess and open the trails back up for this winter. Chainsaws, skidloaders and physical labor combined to recondition the trails for snowmobile use.

At Big Creek, the club partnered with the Iowa Department of Natural Resources (IDNR) to clean up the wooded trails with heavy equipment brought in to remove downed trees. This coordinated effort was the result of several years of working with IDNR officials to maintain snowmobile access through the state park.

"You can't believe how much weeds and other overgrowth take over the trails down there in the off-season," Starmer said while on a break during last year's Snowmobile Iowa ride Feb. 1. "The

IDNR lets us use their equipment to take care of the clearing, and park crews help with the mowing and tree trimming. When we're all done, we have a very nice trail there."

"We have a very good working relationship with the IDNR at Big Creek," club member Steve Klinkefus added.

Staying close to home to ride

The intent of the ISSA's Snowmobile Iowa program is to help Iowans discover some of the hidden trail gems in the state. With the ongoing coronavirus pandemic, riders may be looking to stay home even more this winter; and by the time the snow flies, neighboring states may be urging the same to control the spread, according to some reports.

"With the impact of COVID-19 this year, this may be a good opportunity to keep everyone close to home to ride," Past ISSA President Chris Willey said at the Nov. 15 ISSA Board of Directors meeting.





as last year, touring Big Creek first before turning north and east on the Heart of Iowa trail. The club maintains 120 miles of trail in Region 7, and the Heart of Iowa accounts for 32 miles and Big Creek adds another 14-mile stretch of scenic touring.

Both sections are open to other trail users, and during last year's Snowmobile Iowa ride, participants had to yield to fat tire bicycle enthusiasts on the Saturday morning portion through Big Creek. Located in and around the Des Moines metro area, Saylorville club members said they are used to sharing trails.

"We have to get along with other trail users," Starmer said. "We can't kick them off, so we have to work together."

Besides the wooded area, Big Creek also offers trails through prairie land and wetlands where narrow passes and pallet bridges help keep riders from straying off course. In fact, some areas through the park are so intimate that the groomer can't fit through, providing quite a contrast to the wide-open Heart of Iowa trail.

Last year's ride drew more than 30 participants, making it one of the largest turnouts in the five-year history of the Snowmobile Iowa program. "We appreciate that," Andreini said during a trail break last year. "We want people to learn where the best trails are in Iowa so we can do more riding in our own state. We are just thrilled to have this many people here today."

Among those joining the ride last February was Chris Whitney

from Rippey, a member of the Raccoon Valley Snow Chasers club, also in Region 7. He had participated in the 2018 ride and said a repeat trip over to the Saylorville trails was never a doubt last season.

"The Big Creek trail is really nice to go through, and the park is a nice area to ride when there's snow," said Whitney, piloting a 2018 Yamaha Sidewinder.

"Big Creek definitely gives you that northwoods feel," Saylorville club member John Kahler pointed out.
