

Guest Column

Everything You Need to Know About the Trail Grant Process

For the current snow season, the Iowa Department of Natural Resources (IDNR) partnered with 52 snowmobile clubs and the ISSA to provide for groomed and signed trails and to strengthen snowmobiling in the state. This was accomplished through grants awarded as provided by the Code of Iowa and the Iowa Administrative Code. Revenue generated for grant awards mostly comes from machine registrations and resident and nonresident user permits.

Each year, the Snowmobile Program Manager determines the amount of money available for grants, taking into consideration the other fixed costs of the program. The largest of these fixed costs are trail insurance, signs, repair, replacement and additions of grooming equipment and enforcement, which includes machines and gear. During the 2014-2015 grant period, \$263,635.00 was awarded to the clubs and ISSA. During the 2013-2014 grant period, \$217,846.00 was awarded to the clubs and ISSA.

As the grant portion of the snowmobile program continues to improve upon processes, several changes have been made. What follows here is a breakdown of the parts of the grant cycle and the most important things you need to know:

Who is Eligible? What is Covered?

Incorporated private organizations, cities and counties are eligible to apply for snowmobile grants. Each club is responsible for maintaining an active status with the Iowa Secretary of State's Office. To verify your information, go to http://sos.iowa.gov/ search/business/search.aspx. Enter your club's name into the search box to get current results.

Grant applications from clubs can be used for the cost of grooming equipment, which includes maintenance, repair, operation and trail development. Those expenses can include gates, fence openings, culverts and permanent bridges.

Eligible items for ISSA officers can include in-state travel expenses, mileage for meetings and hauling grooming equipment or the education teaching simulator. groomer education courses and promotion and education expenses related to snowmobiling in the

Expenses for trail signs, trail insurance

and major repairs or purchases of grooming equipment are directly paid by the IDNR to the vendor.

There have been program decisions made which affect items commonly asked for by clubs. Fees for storage of grooming equipment are not currently being covered. If a club receives fuel for grooming, it is not eligible to receive fuel for mowing.

Sign posts and hardware are not being covered. Trailheads and trailhead signage are not covered at this time but a comprehensive approach to addressing this issue is being developed.

Building a Trail Bridge?

Bridge-building projects may require permits from the IDNR (Flood Plains and Sovereign Lands) and the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers. If the project involves construction, excavation or filling in streams, lakes, wetlands on the flood plains or on public lands/waters under the jurisdiction of the IDNR, a joint application form from Protecting Iowa Waters should be submitted to both agencies to begin the permit process. velopment, in particular if you are adding miles to your trail system, you will need to provide the following: bridge permits, proof of easement agreements and the work needs to be shown on your trail map submitted with your grant application. It is preferred that this information includes GPS points, but at a minimum, it needs to be drawn on your trail map. Failure to provide this information will affect the funding decision for this item.

In general the program awards \$500 for maintenance on equipment without further documentation of need. If your club has expenses in excess of \$500, you will need to note that on your application. This can be achieved by detailing what expenses over \$500 you anticipate, be it for filters, oil, etc. The reviewers only have the information you provide to make their decisions. Make sure they understand your need.

If you want to make a purchase that is over \$500, you only need to provide one bid or quote. If you need an item purchased and it is possibly available through an already established state contract, please contact me for assistance with your documentation

As noted earlier, many program-related items are directly paid by the IDNR to the vendor. The grant review committee still needs documentation of need and cost in order to make a determination. If a direct-pay item is awarded to your club, that amount will not be included in your cooperative agreement. It does need to be included in the total amount which is being funded as part of the review and selection process, so it needs to be included with your application.

Grant Application Deadline is May 1

The updated grant application is posted on the IDNR website at www.iowadnr.gov along with other useful information. The IDNR must be in receipt of your completed grant application by 4:30 p.m. on Friday, May 1. Grants received after this date will not be eligible for consideration.

The grant application has seven major parts. Your club application must include the following: club information, groomer information (if applicable), operational expenses and the minority impact statement. If your club is not applying for funds for existing trail needs and development, new trail development or a groomer request, then you do not need to include those sec-

Other items which need to be sent in with your application are copies of existing leases or easements on permanent bridges, if applicable, and a copy of your club's trail maps.

Per the equipment agreement which

each club has with the IDNR for the use of state-owned grooming equipment, the club is required to provide pictures of this equipment annually. These are collected at the same time that your club's grant application is due. The snowmobile program prefers a digital copy of those pictures so if you want to take pictures while you have the groomer out on the trails this season, please email them to me at Rhonda. Fowler@dnr.iowa.gov.

Scoring Criteria Includes Three Tiers

The IDNR Snowmobile Program will be scoring grants using a three-tier system.

Tier 1: Operations Expenses. These are amounts which are needed for repair and upkeep of the grooming equipment, fuel, maintenance, leases, etc. These items are not competitive. The goal of the program is to first allocate operations expenses before approving money for trail development.

Tier 2: Existing Trail Development Expenses. These are amounts which are needed to maintain or repair existing trail features. The goal of the program is to address existing trail needs prior to approving funds for new trail development. These items are somewhat competitive in that the more they meet the scoring criteria, the higher their priority becomes for funding.

Tier 3: New Trail Development Expenses. These are amounts which are needed to develop new trail systems or connector trails. Items in this section will be evaluated for funding after Tier 1 and Tier 2 amounts have been awarded.

Review and Selection Meeting May 29

While grant applications are due May 1, the meeting for the ISSA/IDNR Joint Review and Selection Committee to make recommendations for funding to the IDNR Director's Office will be held on Friday, May 29, at 10 a.m. It will be held in Meeting Room A of the Urbandale Public Library. This is an open meeting and everyone is invited to attend. It is a good opportunity for clubs to see the process used to determine award amounts and to answer any questions which the committee may have.

The committee is comprised of three IDNR representatives and two ISSA representatives. For the FY 16 grant award period, committee members are David Downing, Snowmobile Program Manager; Sherry Arntzen, Executive Officer with the Parks Bureau; Tom Basten, District Supervisor with the DNR Parks Bureau: Merv Hoerrman, ISSA; and Terry Durby, ISSA.

Following this meeting, the committee



recommendation will be forwarded to the IDNR Director's Office for approval, denial or modification. Upon signature, these are the amounts which will be awarded and included in the cooperative agreement which Kathleen Moench will send to the clubs in an e-mail approximately July 1.

The primary e-mail contact provided on the application will be the one used for this correspondence. It is very important that the club let the DNR know if that person has changed between the time the application was submitted and when the cooperative agreement is sent out. Kathleen's e-mail will contain information on what the club is required to do with the cooperative agreement.

Amendments and Prepayments

If an amendment or prepayment is needed, there are processes already in place to address these needs. A prepayment should only occur if the club is asking for a substantial amount of money for a project that they cannot financially maintain with their own resources. The club should contact me

to discuss what steps need to be put into place for a prepayment to be granted.

During the course of a snow season, items may be needed by the club that they did not anticipate at the time they applied for their grant. There are two ways to address these situations. If the awarded amount is sufficient to cover the extra expense but the club needs to move some money from one category to another one, the club should contact Kathleen for authorization to do this. If the expense requires additional money to be awarded to the club, an amendment will need to be submitted to me.

This request will then be forwarded to the members of the review and selection committee for a vote and approval as is done with the original grant applications. A sample amendment request can be found at http://www.iowadnr.gov/Recreation/Snowmobiles/SnowmobileGrants.aspx.



ISSA officers, directors and members are planning a memorial snowmobile ride across the northern tier of Iowa in February to pay tribute to one of the organization's most influential leaders.

The David Carmichael Memorial Snowmobile Ride will begin in Spencer around 9 a.m. on Feb. 26 and end in Cresco, Saturday night, Feb. 28. David Carmichael Memorial Snowmobile Ride

Vintage ice racing returns to Clear Lake this month for the sixth installment of the Jack Helgren Memorial Iowa LeMans Championship Race. The two-day event begins Friday night, Jan. 16, with pre-registration and a cruise around the lake.

Racing starts promptly at 10 a.m. the following morning with registration opening at 7:30 a.m. and practice laps at 9:15 a.m.

A mandatory driver's meeting at 9:45 a.m. and the Clear Lake V.F.W. Honor Guard complete the pre-race ceremonies.

Featuring a \$4,000 purse this year, the competition includes 20 classes of vintage snowmobile racing. Depending on the year, each race will have a minimum of five laps. "The newer the sled, the longer the race," explained race promoter Gary McVicker.

In true LeMans style, each race will begin with the operator separated from his or her sled and then running to start the engine after race officials drop their arms. Racers then snake their away around an unmanicured, staked course with electronic lap-counters keeping track of their progress.

The course is generally a mile long, but the length can vary based on ice depth and surface conditions. The often rough terrain tests both rider and machine, as race categories are usually defined by the size of the motor and the type of suspension.

To broaden interest, a number of special races are thrown in as well, including a Powder Puff class for women and the 80-plus

category, where the age of the machine and the age of the rider must exceed 80 years. Event organizers are also hoping to set up a "mini LeMans" course for youth 120 racing this year.

Capping off race day will be the Stud Boy 50 Open Mod Championship Race with \$400 going to the race winner. Simultaneous to the racing activity Saturday afternoon will be radar runs with \$500 and a trophy going to the fastest run of the day.

Vintage sleds will also be on display.

All events for the Jack weekend will be based on the south end of Clear Lake near Clear Lake State Park, the same venue for the past three years. So far, lake conditions are favorable to holding the event as scheduled. Back-up dates are Feb. 6-7.

"I was little concerned about the weather at first but I'm getting pretty comfortable with the way things look now," said McVicker, who conceived the idea for the event after the 2009 passing of long-time snowmobile dealer Jack Helgren of Mason City.

McVicker said the event has since grown beyond the local tribute and has

become a destination for snowmobilers from around the upper Midwest each winter. Last year's draw was 160 race entries with competitors from Iowa, Minnesota and Wisconsin.

"The Jack continues to exceed my expectations," McVicker said. "We are getting more people around the state to participate in the event. Word is a big group from Fairbanks and another



one from Cedar Rapids are planned to come up this year. Not too bad considering I came up with this idea one day while driving truck."

Officially, the event is sponsored by the North Iowa Snow Seekers snowmobile club of Region 3, and they receive help from neighboring clubs Iowa River Riders and Hancock County Snowmobile Association.

A race committee of 24 meets regularly to plan the event, and sponsorships continue to grow. As an indication of their future



commitment to the Jack Race, organizers purchased electronic lap-counting equipment and radar run lights.

"This is a good event," McVicker said. "It's grown to the point now we have to keep it going. People are looking forward to coming here. You go to Hay Days to promote the race, and

they now have heard of it. It's simply amazing how well it's gone. It's been a lot of fun."

Although pleased with the current draw, McVicker said attendance would even be greater if Mother Nature would cooperate and bring snow to the area. That way, local spectators could ride the trails to the event and out-of-state visitors could stay longer to enjoy what the area has to offer.

"We can always hope for more snow," McVicker said. "If we

Lifetime Achievement and Snowmobiler of the Year

Ringhart Remem

Pirector Mol Birelant in Line Properties Line 12 Director Mel Rinehart is being remembered as a tireless club volunteer who never met a piece of iron he didn't like. Rinehart died unexpectedly Jan. 15, 2014, while on a business trip to North Dakota. He was 60 years old.

Posthumously, Rinehart was named the 2014 ISSA Snowmobiler of the Year and also received the ISSA's Lifetime Achievement Award at the 2014 ISSA Annual Convention in Dubuque Nov. 22. Close friend and ISSA Awards Committee Chair Mindy Scott presented the awards to Rinehart's widow, Diane, at the Saturday evening banquet.

"Mel was a talented engineer who loved to design and build new equipment his clubs could use to improve their grooming experience and to improve area trail

conditions," Scott said, struggling to hold back her emotion during the presentation. "He loved challenges, especially those associated with improving the shortfalls of existing equipment."

In addition to his service to the ISSA, Rinehart of North Liberty, a career engineer, was a member of three neighboring clubs in Region 12: the Snowdrifters of Johnson County, the Eastern Iowa Sledheads and the Cedar County Winter Warriors.

Among his credited projects were redesigning the snowblade used on the Snowdrifters groomer, rebuilding the Winter Warriors groomer and redesigning and updating the flail mower currently operated by the Sledheads.

"How many of you have a guy in your club who gets things

done?" asked Snowdrifters Secretary Derrick Parker during the awards banquet. "For us, it was Mel Rinehart. He never met a piece of equipment he couldn't improve. I want to thank Mel for what he did for our club, and I also want to thank Diane for everything she let him do for our club."

Last February, the Snowdrifters held a memorial fun run in Rinehart's honor. Making an appearance at the event was "Dewey," the club-owned 1969 Bombardier groomer Rinehart spent a lot of time wrenching on, including rebuilding the engine.

"That thing runs perfect. I would take it out any day," Parker said of the vintage machine. "Mel always had a huge passion

for equipment and wanted to make sure our club had the right machine in the right place. He had a vision."

In addition to his mechanical aptitude, Rinehart was also acknowledgedforhisstewardship for the land. He worked closely with local authorities on creating and establishing snowmobile trails and was a stickler for proper trail preparation and signage.

"He taught me about the conservation of the land," Parker added. "He also made sure the trails were marked properly for the guy who wasn't familiar with our area."

According to his nomination form, Rinehart would spend several weekends working to improve the trails in his area.

He personally maintained 50 miles of trail, and several pictures showed him with a chainsaw in hand, clearing brush and widening

"His biggest passion was for the trails," Scott said.

What follows here are snapshots of each award winner as compiled by the ISSA Awards Committee. This recap, along with the winner profiles on pages 13 and 16, also continues convention coverage that was started in the December issue of the *Iowa* Snowmobiler. Pictured with each award winner is then-ISSA President Jim Willey.

Youth Snowmobiler of the Year

The 2014 ISSA Youth Snowmobiler of the Year Award went to Isabelle Willey of Manchester, daughter of Chris and Andrea Willey and a member of the Snow Pioneers of Region 5.

She was nominated for the award by her home club and was recognized for her participation in local and statewide snowmobiling events, including helping to sell raffle tickets at past conventions and campouts.

Snowmobiling's influence on her also carries through to the



classroom. According her nomination papers, Willey "shares with classmates the benefits of belonging to a local club and uses the theme of winter for many of her school projects."

She also organized the grooming of her school's cross-country trails for cross-country skiers and is also inviting friends to go

riding with her on weekends or after school. She also participated in the ISSA's youth snowmobile program.

On the club level, Willey actively participates in club events and helped to sell sponsorships on the club's trail maps. She is also not afraid to jump in the groomer with her father "to help gain an understanding on how, why and when the club grooms its trails," her nomination continues.

Recently upgrading to 550 Arctic Cat Cougar, Willey attended the 2013 proclamation signing of Snowmobile Safety Week along with her grandfather, then-ISSA president Jim Willey.

"She used the opportunity to speak to the governor about passing the bill that allowed younger riders to operate their own sled on state-funded trails with their families," her nomination explained.

Lady Snowmobiler of the Year


astern Iowa Sledheads President Mindy Scott of Lone Tree has been named the 2014 ISSA Lady Snowmobiler of the Year.

Scott has been involved with the sport for 39 years and is a strong proponent of organized snowmobiling. In addition to her home club, she is a member of four other Iowa clubs.

At the state level, she is an active member of the ISSA and currently chairs its Awards Committee. She also belongs to the Michigan and Minnesota state snowmobile associations and is known in national snowmobile circles for her key role in the ISSA's hosting of the International Snowmobile Congress in Coralville in 2010.

On the local level, Scott has held the office of club president, and vice president and takes care of filling out the trail grant applications. She also submits season-end grant reports and maintains the club's landowner list for insurance.

"Mindy has been a resource to neighboring clubs on the annual grant paperwork as

Scott has worked with homeowners, landowners and city councils to address issues and share laws and regulations associated with snowmobiling. She also coordinated a critical meeting between key legislators from her area to help move the registration increase and trail permit out of committee.

Scott is a regular at the annual ISSA conventions and is not afraid to assist with trail work, including bridge building, community projects and providing meals to work crews.

Young Adult Snowmobiler of the Year

The 2014 ISSA Young Adult Snowmobiler of the Year award belongs to Vincent Boock of the Snow Pioneers. He was nominated for the award by his home club.


Boock was recognized for his work on recruiting younger members to his club. He acts as a liaison between the high school and the club and regularly organizes rides to school and plans weekend outings so others can learn the trail system.

According to his nomination form, he helps with trail development and preparation, including securing landowner leases and marking

and maintaining about 13 miles of trail in Delaware County,

When he turned 18, he became certified to operate his club's groomer and attended city council meetings to seek a partnership between the city and the snowmobile club so his hometown could become a Snowmobile Friendly Community.







Snowmobile Families of the Year

Nominated by the Eastern Iowa Sledheads of Region 12, the Ron and Theresa Sexton and the Randy and Laurie Sexton families of Riverside have been named the 2014 ISSA Families of the Year.

Now spanning multiple generations, the Sextons have been involved in the sport of snowmobiling since the mid-1970s. They are very active in their local club, holding officer positions and serving on several committees.

In their community, family members served on the Riverside Trails Committee to ensure the club would not lose access to the trail system. According to their nomination form, "they encouraged a partnership between the community and the club that resulted in a multi-purpose trail through town."

Donating their time and equipment, the family then stepped up and helped build a bridge on the multi-use trail. In fact, any time there is trailwork to be done, chances are more than one Sexton family member will be on hand to lend their skills to the project.

"They have provided and operate the equipment required to set most of the bridges on our trail system, with the largest being over 65 feet in length," their write-up continues.

This family was an active voice in stumping for the snowmobile registration fee increase and the creation of the trail permit. According to club members, "the family—from the youngest to the oldest—attended a critical meeting held with local legislators, showing snowmobiling was truly a *family* sport."

Sexton family members also initiated a fundraiser for Spina Bifida and engaged club members to help with a toy drive for children hospitalized at Christmas. Their charitable work also included pouring a new sidewalk for a family in need.

Groomer Operator of the Year

Floyd County Groomers Association Trail Coordinator Steve King of Marble Rock has been named the 2014 ISSA Groomer Operator of the Year.



Nominated by his home club, King is a member of six snowmobile clubs and strongly believes in trail connectivity. Toward that goal, he has worked with other snowmobilers in his area, and presently, his club's trail system connects with five other clubs in nine locations.

As trail coordinator, he coordinates trail marking days each



fall and sign removal deadlines each spring. He is responsible for submitting the trail grant application and sign orders to the state and also maintains a current landowner list.

Riding sleds since 1969, he also serves as the club's Trail Manager for the Polaris Trail Map App and has GPSd all of the trails in his county. He also supported the use of GPS unit in the groomer to ensure all groomer operators knew the correct location of each trail.

King takes his responsibilities as trails coordinator very seriously. He helped lobby for the club's new groomer three years ago and regularly maintains the unit while it is stored at his shop.

Having suffered through an older groomer with countless breakdowns, his goal for the club's new groomer is to have all of the club's trails groomed within a 24-hour period after a snowfall.

"During the season, he keeps operators informed of the status of the groomer and spends countless hours operating the groomer to achieve that end," his nomination reads.



Snowmobile Dealer of the Year

Redline Powersports of Manchester has been named the 2014 ISSA Snowmobile Dealer of Year. Owners Ryan Bunting and Mitchell Helle were recognized for their support of the ISSA and local clubs.

According to its nomination form, the dealership has been an active member of the Snow Pioneers since opening in May of 2012. They support area grass drags and provide discounts on labor to current club members.

"This dealership also keeps ISSA material on hand to distribute to customers and also pomotes memmbership in both the local club and the ISSA by having membership forms available in-house for customers to sign up with," the write-up continues.

Area trails maps are also available at the counter, and tickets for the ISSA's Grand Raffle are readily available for sale. The dealership also volunteers with the local landowner appreciation dinner and helps organize vintage rides.

They also hold a photo contest with giveaways to the public and initiated a fundraiser for the local D.A.R.E. program.

Anyone who may plan to ride the Five Star Snow Trails Association trail north of Cedar Falls and Waterloo should take note of a major change that has occurred. For many years, the Sno Hawks have maintained a trail staging area located at the intersection of the relocated US Highway 218 and County Road C57 between Cedar Falls and Janesville. In preparation for complete re-construction of that intersection by the Iowa DOT, the former parking area has been purchased by the DOT and access to the property has been transferred to the contracting firm and can no longer be used by snowmobilers. Entry to that property will be considered TRESPASSING. Other options for a staging area have been explored, but as yet we have found no good alternative. We apologize for the inconvenience.


