IDNR Clarifies Special Event Permit Guidelines

The Iowa Department of Natural Resources (IDNR) receives applications for special events which do not meet the criteria for needing a permit. The best advice I can give someone regarding a special event is to talk to their local Conservation Officer. Your local Conservation Officer will help you make the determination of when a permit is needed, as well as discuss any stipulations which will be part of your permit if approved.

Here is what you need to know about snowmobile special events:

- The only vehicle type which can be part of your event is a snowmobile as defined in Iowa Code Section 321G.1. Any modification to a snowmobile must comply with the definition.
- The IDNR processes applications for events which take place on land, water and frozen water which is under the iurisdiction of the Natural Resource Commission (NRC). If you are unsure if your event is located in an area covered by this provision, your local Conservation Officer will help to identify this for you.
- The permit issued for your event will specify registration requirements for participants.
- If your event is on public land, water or frozen water, but not under the jurisdiction of the NRC, you should still contact your local Conservation Officer to discuss the details of your event.

- If your local Conservation Officer instructs you to submit an application for your event, it must be submitted at least 30 days out. Any applicant gets one pass on this. The IDNR is under no obligation to accommodate a late submittal.
 - Snowmobile event applications can

include alternate dates for the event as snow cover can vary. Discuss your plan with your local Conservation Officer before submitting the applica-

• The \$25 administrative fee for processing the application is nonrefundable, even if your application is denied or not needed.

Your local Conservation Officer is a great resource to advise you as you plan and execute successful events. To find the office nearest you, visit iowadnr.gov/About-DNR/DNR-Staff-Offices/Conservation-Law-Enforcement. The permit application can be found here: programs.iowadnr.gov/ specialevents. A map with contact information is also printed on the inside back cover of this month's issue.

Special Event definition at iowadnr.gov

he lowa Department of Natural Resources (IDNR) is authorized to approve a I club or individual to hold an organized special event (an organized race, exhibition or demonstration of limited duration which is conducted according to a prearranged schedule and in which general public interest is manifested) within the state if the event is scheduled to be held on public land or public ice under the jurisdiction of the Natural Resource Commission. The IDNR shall designate the equipment and facilities necessary for the safe operation of vehicles and for the safety of operators, participants and observers.

Residents participating in a special event must display a current registration and user permit decal on their vehicles Non-residents must display a valid, Iowa nonresident user permit on their vehicles. If permitted by the IDNR, registration requirements can be waived for participants if they are operating within the boundaries of the event and register with the sponsor.

For clarification on when a Special Event Permit is needed and how vehicle registration requirements are applicable, applicants are encouraged to speak with their local Conservation Officer prior to submitting their application.

At least 30 days before the scheduled date of a special event, an application must be filed with the DNR using the Special Events web-based application found at programs.iowadnr.gov/specialevents/. The application fee is \$25 and is nonrefundable.



Ylub members interested in operating state-owned grooming equipment this winter need to be certified by the Iowa State Snowmobile Trail Grant Program, as administered by the ISSA's Review and Selection Committee (RSC).

Following a two-year push by the RSC, most operators should have been certified or re-certified by Jan. 1 earlier this year. If anyone failed to meet that deadline, at least four training courses are currently planned this pre-season:

- Region 7: Nov. 14 from 1 p.m. to 3 p.m. at the Quality Inn and Suites, Ames
- Region 5: Nov. 19, hosted by Clayton County Snowbirds. Location TBD.
- Region 3: Dec. 2 at 6:15 p.m. at the **Coulter Community Center, Coulter**
- Region 5/9: Dec. 3 along Highway 20 corridor. Location TBD.

For more information on the classes, contact the RSC by email at ISSA.RSC@ gmail.com. Clubs in western Iowa interested in hosting a class should reach out to instructor Randy Magg at (712) 320-6244.

Past ISSA President Chris Willey, coadministrator of the RSC and the state's groomer training coordinator, is currently updating each club's roster of certified operators and will distribute that list to clubs prior to the start of the season.

Certification now lasts five years. Operators no longer receive groomer training cards. Instead, a list of certified operators should be kept in the cab of the groomer and made available upon request. In addition to classroom training, a new operator needs to complete hands-on skills testing with a certified operator from his or her club prior to operating equipment on his or

The purpose behind the training is to minimize downtime and reduce unnecessary damage to grooming equipment caused by operator error. Counting the drag, new groomers can cost upwards of \$200,000 and repairs can be very costly. Having the right people running the equipment is just as important as preventative maintenance during the off-season.

Training courses normally last a couple of hours. Once club members have received the training and have completed their ride-along, they are eligible to operate state-owned grooming equipment. If a club is found to have non-certified members operating their groomer, they run the risk of losing that piece of equipment.

"If you're not on your club's roster, you will need to show up to a class and get certified," Willey said. "We're not going to keep chasing people down. What I send out will be the end-all list for operators. We understand there will not always be a class close by where you live, but if you really want to be an operator, you will need to find a way to get to a class."

ISSA RSC Skips 2020 Round of RTP Grant Funding

The Iowa State Snowmobile Trail Grant Program did not submit an application to the federal Recreational Trails Program (RTP) this fall, citing a backlog of unobligated funding from the three previous grant

"We did not put in a grant application this year because we have three active grants that we need to use up," explained program co-administrator Chris Willey, a past ISSA president, at the time. "Until we get this ironed out and figure out where we can spend the money on, we are going to hold off on any more grant requests."

Since that decision, the program has agreed to purchase a used 2018 Tucker 2000 groomer. Up until then, the program had been working with three outstanding grant awards totaling close to \$800,000. Purchases with RTP money must comply with the Buy American Act, and presently, only Tuckers produced after 2018 qualify.

Expected to be delivered at this month's convention in Ames, the used Tucker is heading to the Iowa River Riders in Region 3. That club worked with the Franklin County Board of Supervisors to apply for an RTP grant on behalf of the ISSA's Review and Selection Committee (RSC) three years ago.

Managed by the RSC since 2017, the state snowmobile program has relied on RTP funding for groomer purchases for 20 years now. The total amount of federal trail money appropriated to Iowa each year is in

the neighborhood of \$1.2-\$1.4 million. By rule, those funds are divided among three trail user groups: motorized (30 percent), non-motorized (30 percent) and diversified (40 percent).

Through a cost-share grant application process, the snowmobile program in Iowa has typically received between \$200,000 and \$240,000 annually to purchase snowmobile trail grooming equipment. Using snowmobile registration receipts, the program pays for the equipment up front and then receives 80 percent of the funding back through RTP reimbursement.

RTP grant applications are graded by the Iowa Recreational Trails Advisory Board each fall. RSC member and ISSA Region 7 Director John Kahler represents snowmobiling interests on that board. That volunteer committee is expected to meet Nov. 16 to determine awards for the 21 grant applications received this year.

Historically, only snowmobilers and OHV groups apply for the motorized portion of the RTP funding. When the latter learned the ISSA was not planning to submit an application this year, the Iowa OHV program submitted a second grant request, according to Kahler.

"We gave up part of our share of the grant money this year so we can hopefully ask for more next year," noted snowmobile program co-administrator Terry Durby, another past ISSA president.

ISC 2022 Fundraising Raffle set for New Year's Day

The ISSA will be hosting the 2022 Inter-The ISSA will be nosting the Zalantional Snowmobile Congress in June of 2022 at the Grand River Conference Center in Dubuque, host site of the 2014 ISSA Convention. This four-day event will serve as the 54th annual gathering of snowmobile leaders from North America, Scandinavia and Russia.

Andrea Willey, chair of the 2014 ISSA Convention Planning Committee, is heading the 2022 ISC Planning Committee. The committee has been meeting bi-monthly since January, when the ISSA Board of Directors approved the ISSA's hosting of this prestigious event.

"We are excited about this opportunity to bring snowmobilers back to Iowa, but we also know we have a lot of work to do to get to that point," Andrea Willey said of Iowa's third time serving as ISC host.

Following the 2021 ISC in Nebraska next June, the committee will begin meeting monthly and eventually weekly as the date gets closer. Their work right now focuses on raising money to help promote the international event, including hosting the hospitality room in Omaha at the 53rd ISC.

Some seed money remains from the last time the ISSA hosted Congress at Coralville in 2010. The committee also plans to apply for an administrative grant from the federal Recreational Trails Program next year to help offset expenses.

In October, the committee announced a fundraising raffle set for New Year's Day. The Jan. 1 drawing is for the winner's choice of a \$3,500 travel voucher or \$3,000 in cash. Only 400 tickets are being printed, and tickets cost \$25 each.


Trails Unlimited

State Convention Moving Forward as Planned

The ISSA Board of Directors gave • organizers for this fall's convention a boost of confidence when they decided ahead of schedule to move forward with the 47th annual gathering Nov. 13-15 at the Quality Inn and Suites in Ames.

The board had set a Nov. 1 go/no-go date for convention weekend but ended up making the decision two weeks earlier at its Oct. 18 meeting. The ongoing coronavirus pandemic had been the source of the uncertainty, but with convention less than a month away, board members felt the need to make a commitment.

"My opinion is we just have to go for it," Past ISSA President Terry Durby said. "We're going to move forward and take any measures we need to take when the time comes."

This year's convention is hosted by clubs in Region 7 with Region 7 Director John Kahler serving as chair of the planning committee. The week leading up to the board meeting, Kahler had voiced concerns to the board about the lack of convention registrations and hotel reservations caused by contingency planning.

"We need to discuss whether or not we are proceeding with the convention as planned, and if so, what will be the minimum registrations required to pull this thing off?" Kahler asked in an email to the board.

With a number of board members turning in registrations at the meeting, the board's decision will hopefully give ISSA members



the confidence to send in their registrations and to make hotel reservations as well. A host fee had already been paid to the hotel, and seminars and entertainment have since been finalized.

Safety precautions

As he has said since the beginning planning stages, Kahler said conventiongoers will be expected to comply with social distancing guidelines and to follow any and all recommendations from the state and the Center for Disease Control. He said disposable masks and hand sanitizers will be available at stations throughout the conference center.

With safety precautions in place, Kahler said moving forward with convention is significant and allows the ISSA to conduct its business, including electing new officers and directors. At convention, President Brian Carmichael will fulfill his two-year term, and Vice President Scott Nauman is expected to assume that leadership role.

During the Saturday morning General Assembly, ISSA membership will be asked



SU Team railblocks

Editor's Note: For the sixth straight winter, the CyClean snowmobile team at Iowa State University participated in the SAE Clean Snowmobile Challenge at Michigan Tech University in Houghton, Mich., March 9-14.

With the ISSA convention so close to campus this year, the team of engineering students is slated to give a presentation at the Ames event Nov. 14. What follows here is the team's recap of their 2020 campaign.

ISU CSC Team Report

The 2019-20 season was one like no other for Cyclone Snowmobile Engineering. Despite unexpected roadblocks and lessthan-ideal snowcover, the team persevered and was determined to compete for their sixth year at the SAE Clean Snowmobile Challenge in Houghton, Mich.

The first large event the team attended was the grass drags hosted by the Saylorville Dam Snowmobile Club in Region 7. The team enjoyed the opportunity to watch other snowmobilers race their creations, as well as getting the opportunity to compete with their own! The event was a success.

Last season was not without its challenges, however. Over the course of the year, the team faced issues involving a stuck dynamometer as well as a blown engine. The dynamometer failure resulted in the team having to cancel aggressive testing plans for early February, and the engine loss left the team questioning their ability to compete in Michigan, which was just a few weeks away.

However, thanks to the generosity of Arctic Cat, the team was able to secure a new engine and had the swap completed in under 48 hours. They immediately got to work integrating the new tech-

nology and were able to attend the competition as if nothing had happened.

Innovations

For the 2019-20 season, Cyclone Snowmobile Engineering focused on reducing noise and emissions pollutants while increasing the fuel efficiency and rideability through various innovations. Key projects included an exhaust system redesign, a custom air intake, fine-tuning with a Link Engine Management ECU and chassis innovations.

Exhaust. The stock resonator was replaced with a custom muffler designed to focus on sound reduction and emission cleanliness. Three catalytic converters were integrated, and destructive interference from five resonance chambers was utilized to deaden the sound. Air velocity and pressure maps were created using ANSYS software to determine where to place the catalytic converters to optimize performance.





Air Intake. An air intake from a turbo Arctic Cat model was modified to replace the stock air intake on the sled. This allowed the ability to collect mass airflow data to send to the ECU, for which an adapter was fabricated. Injectors from a Yamaha turbo engine were incorporated to allow for tuning with Ethanol. As a result of these innovations, the sled was able to run more efficiently on Ethanol fuel,

and the engine bay became significantly easier to service.

ECU and Wiring Harness. A new wiring harness was created in order to more effectively integrate the Link G4+ Fury ECU used previously. Additionally, an ethanol sensor was integrated, and fine-tuning with the ECU and engine allowed for compatibility with 0-100% ethanol. A closedloop lambda system was utilized in the tuning process to allow the sled to continuously receive and interpret feedback from the ethanol sensor to run efficiently on the type of fuel used.





Chassis. The shocks on the sled were adjusted to accommodate the heat shielding and weight distribution. Woody's Dooly 8" Carbides were added to improve handling and were also optimized to work with the weight added by the exhaust. The integration of a studded track improved traction and acceleration, making for a


more powerful and enjoyable riding experience.

Miscellaneous Projects. Along with the main innovations completed to innovate the snowmobile, many projects to aid the team in general were also completed. These included the design, validation and fabrication of a new burnout box as well as sled wheels, allowing for increased testing capabilities and improved mobility of the snowmobile.









Competition Recap

The 2020 SAE Clean Snowmobile Challenge went extremely well for the Iowa State team. Although the situation regarding COVID-19 resulted in the competition being cut short, the team was able to compete in all events that were not cancelled due to the virus. Despite

facing many obstacles—such as air pockets in the coolant line and suspension bolts coming loose mid-event—the team is extremely proud of how they competed and all that was accomplished this season. They are ready for the challenges next season will bring their way and look forward to competing in the 2021 SAE Clean Snowmobile Challenge in March!






