## Region 12 Club Profile

# What a Difference a Year Makes for Southeast Iowa Ridge Blasters

n 1981, the Southeast Iowa Ridge Blasters snowmobile club became an incorporated as a snowmobile club. In the following years, they created trails, purchased their own trail groomer and began raising money for the Spina Bifida Association of Iowa, the ISSA's official charity.

The club and its members were living the dream. Then, for whatever reason, in the late 1990s and early 2000s, membership began declining. Repairs that needed to be done to the groomer could not be afforded, and what was a club of approximately 50 members strong had fallen off to around 11. Despite the downturn, these 11 members, including ISSA stalwarts Fred Strothman, Mike Rauenbuehler and Jim Pickle, still met every month to hold meetings and to keep the club up and running.

Then in July of 2013, what began as two guys talking about a Facebook page—a page where area snowmobilers could share pictures and stores—has grown in to something great again. Jim Fitzgibbon and Aaron Dorothy started asking the questions, "Why can't

we have trails to ride?" "Why can't we have a club that the other snowmobilers of Iowa have?"



And that is when it started. Fitzgibbon and Dorothy began talking to Fred and Jim about the old club and the way it used to be. They both joined the Ridge Blasters, proposed snowmobile routes throughout the county, attended six different city council meetings, contacted the Iowa DOT and began meeting with the Henry County engineer. After receiving approval from a number of

city councils, they assisted in drafting an ordinance for another city and met with the county supervisors. What had seemed like a full-time job for approximately three months straight was finally rewarded with a formal trail system in Henry County of over 60 miles of trails.

Not to mention during those three months, they were boosting membership in the club, and with help from Matt Kinney, they put together a float for two local parades of vintage snowmobiles. It's easy to see why Dorothy was nominated and voted to be club vice president and Fitzgibbon to be secretary/treasurer.

But the work wasn't done yet because those trails need to be cleared and marked, and trail maps needed to be created and printed. That's when the next hurdle became apparent. They had already missed the trail sign order for the year, but a Turn to page 8

valuable lesson was learned at the same time: Snowmobilers stick together. A number of clubs as close as the next county to the north and from as far away as northwestern Iowa all came together with any extra trail signs that they had to provide the Ridge Blasters with the trails signs they needed. With a growing number of members, the work load started to be shared more as well, and with the help of Brian Black, Dallas Kyle and DeWayne Mullen and a few other members, signing those trails only took a couple more weeks.

Then in early December, the club set up their first display booth at the New London holiday stroll. The booth consisted of a few snowmobiles on display, the Iowa Department of Natural Resources (IDNR) snowmobile simulator and a display of the trails, snowmobile information and club t-shirts. It was a big hit, and there were a lot of happy and excited youth that evening.

Then came the snowmobile season, and the trails were finally put to use. By the end of the season, membership had been boosted some 400 percent from July, thanks to all of this hard work. Trail sign removal was divided up and set for the first of April.

After the snow had melted, all of the signs had been pulled and the snowmobiles had been put away for the summer, Fitzgibbon, Dorothy and the rest of the Ridge Blasters started planning for next season. This included a 67-mile trail expansion of mowed, cleared, marked and groomed trails that, when completed, will connect 11 communities and one state park.

Then came the question of how do they make the trail work easier. They turned to the club's IDNR snowmobile trail grant application. Because aside from requesting a number of trail signs for the upcoming year's trail expansion, they had spent a number of evenings and nights researching the right equipment for the job.





They decided on and requested a Polaris Brutus with a Camoplast track kit and an Arrowhead drag. The ISSA/IDNR Review and Selection Committee agreed and approved their request.

At the club's annual meeting in June of this year, members showed their appreciation for the guys by re-electing them to office. Following in their footsteps, even more members stepped up and said, "I want to be a part of this," and took on increased

S nowmobilers in Iowa can save five bucks and be entered into a drawing for a wild boar hunt in northeast Iowa if they register for the 41st Annual ISSA Convention by Oct. 15. After that early bird deadline, the cost jumps to \$60.

As detailed on the convention registration form on page 11, the feral hog hunt is courtesy of the Big Oak Elk Ranch of West Union in Region 5, just one of several partners helping out the ISSA Convention Planning Committee this fall.

According to chair Andrea Willey, the committee has secured more than \$11,000 in donations and pledges. Three of the four sled manufacturers are on board as well as other valuable sponsors, including Camoplast, which also has ties to Region 5.

This year's convention is being held at the Grand Harbor Resort and Waterpark in Dubuque Nov. 21-23. Clubs in Region 5 are hosting the event and are bringing the ISSA Snow Show back after a two-year absence.

Planned for the adjacent Riverview Center on Saturday, the show will feature sleds from local dealers representing all four OEMs as well as the latest in grooming equipment. The Iowa Department of Natural Resources' (IDNR) snowmobile simulator is also expected to make an appearance.

Vendors ranging from sled customization experts to resort owners from Canada and Michigan will be there as well. Snowmobile clubs from across Iowa will also be featured as part of the annual 'Snowmobile Iowa' showcase at convention.

The show is free and open to the public. Doors open at 9 a.m. and close at 5 p.m. If your club is interested in participating in the show, please pre-register by Nov. 1 by filling out the form in the September issue of the *Iowa Snowmobiler* or by visiting the convention website at www.iowasnowmobiler.com/issa/convention.

If you are coming to the snow show, Willey hopes you will make a weekend out of it by staying for the entire convention. Festivities start Friday night with hospitality and continue Saturday with the election of officers, meetings, raffle drawings, seminars and awards banquet.

The convention wraps up Sunday morning with an avalanche awareness seminar and the following ISSA/IDNR workshops: Snowmobile Safety Instructor Certification and Groomer Operator Certification for both new and existing operators. A tentative convention agenda appears on page 11.

"Talk to your fellow club members and encourage people to attend," ISSA President Jim Willey said. "The committee is off to a great start. The clubs in Region 5 are

together, and it's going to be a great convention. We hope to see people there from all over the state."

The hotel has blocked off 100 rooms at the ISSA rate of \$109 per night through Nov. 1. The state snowmobile convention is not the only event at the resort this weekend so Andrea Willey strongly suggests ISSA members reserve their rooms now as they will probably go quickly after the hold date lifts.

As of Aug. 23 ISSA board meeting, "a quarter of those rooms have already been spoken for, and we're three months out, so if you have not booked your rooms, please do so today," she urged.

#### Seminar Line-Up

In addition to the Sunday morning offerings, Saturday afternoon at convention will feature seven informative seminars for ISSA members. Topics range from women in snowmobiling and vintage sled restoration to cold weather survival and trail planning and signing.

• A featured speaker at the 2013 convention in Altoona, Julie-Ann Chapman of British Columbia returns this year to disuss the impact of Women in Snowmobiling as well as their current level of participation in the sport.

An extreme mountain rider, Chapman will also discuss riding techniques and tips for female snowmobilers, sharing her personal preferences for snowmobile set-up and "how to line yourself up for success," Willey said.

• Tapping into her experience as a backcountry rider, Chapman will also lead the seminar on **Cold Weather Survival**. She will be providing tips on how to plan ahead before a trip, what to carry for survival gear, how to dress for the ride and what to do in an emergency.

"If the situation calls for staying out overnight, she will tell you how and where to establish a shelter and how to build and start a fire," Willey said.

Already planned for a morning presentation on Generational Leadership, Raap will spend part of the afternoon on her popular Women's Program: Making the Journey Great. She will discuss the way women deal with all that life throws at them while maintaining the passion to be their personal best every day.

According to Raap's website, "audiences are inspired to consider the impact of not only what they do, but why and how they do it as they discover within themselves the only real secret to success."

• For the tinkerers in the crowd, the Antique Snowmobile Club of America will have a representative on hand at convention Saturday afternoon to discuss the Repair and Restoration of Vintage

The seminar will outline the current state and growth of the vintage/antique hobby and explain the different clubs, organizations and events currently available to the novice enthusiast.

"They also plan to cover some ideas on what to look for in vintage sled acquisition, and what to expect for costs/parts availability

Miner hopes to have an updated manual to hand out on proper trail signage at convention. He will also highlight the expectations of the IDNR, proper insurance coverage and landowner relations.

"As you can see, we have put a lot of effort into convention this year," Willey said. "Speakers are coming in from all over as we are really trying to raise our game. We invite you come over to eastern Iowa this November and have fun while we improve our sport."

# Sibley's Van De Berg Scours the Midwest for That Next Great Barn Find

Tt's a hot August afternoon in the small, northwest Iowa community of Little Rock. The cell phone rings, and on the other end is a snowmobile collector from Wisconsin. He's looking for the Ariens snowmobile cover he saw advertised for sale online recently.

Answering the call is Randy Van De Berg of Sibley, an insurance agent and fellow vintage sled enthusiast. On this day, Van De Berg is unable to satisfy the caller's inquiry as the cover has just been sold. "Sorry," he said, the bad news echoing inside his machine shed on the north end of Main Street.

Regardless of the time of year, Van De Berg regularly fields these types of phone calls, and very rarely does he not come through. Had the out-of-state client been looking for a 1972 Motoski Capri or a 1970 Boatel Grand Prix, he probably could have hooked him up.

You see, Van De Berg is more than a collector; he's a vintage dealer. Some call him a 'sled hunter'; others say he's a 'snowmobile picker', a description made famous by the History Channel show of a similar name. Either way, he's the man to contact if you are in the market for a rare snowmobile.

"I just enjoy buying, selling and trading them," he said, estimating he's owned close to 400 vintage sleds since the self-described obsession began eight years ago. "It's a hobby that's gone mad. It's a disease more than anything. But it sure is fun."

Now numbering around 85 sleds, Van De Berg's collection is spread across three buildings in downtown Little Rock. The machine shed is a former lumber yard. A block south is the 1904 grocery store now known as Randy's Sled Shed, and kitty-corner from there is an alley

garage, the only heated building of the bunch.

None of the storage facilities would qualify as a museum, and to call the garage a showroom would even be a stretch. But that's just fine with Van De Berg. He's more interested in being the middle man, the guy who can find that snowmobile to complete another

man's collection. He wants to give customers "barn-find" that experience.

"I've thought about creating a museum, but I prefer to do it this way. Besides, it's hard to keep them clean in this type of building," he explained, standing in a sea of dusty sleds. "If people want to come over and look at my sleds, I will gladly show them; and if someone is interested in buying one, I will take it over to my garage shop and clean it up."

#### **Renewed Connections**

Usually by the time a sled migrates south to the smallest of his three buildings, it's been sold and is awaiting delivery to its new owner. Staged in his garage on this summer day were a 1972 AMF Ski-Daddler, a 1973 AMF Harley-Davidson and an Arctic Cat Panther 440, among others. Standing out from the crowd was a fully-restored 1970 Chaparral,

"When I sell them, I try to make them as nice as I can," Van De Berg said. "I've been doing this long enough that people know my name. They know if they deal with me, it's a straight shot and the sled is represented as advertised. I've even had guys show up and say it's nicer than I said it was. I'd rather have my buyers happy when they leave than disappointed."

In all, eight of the garage-stored vintage snowmobiles were being shipped off to a retired fuel hauler near Lloydminster, Alberta, Canada. The two met at the 2013 Waconia Ride-In at Waconia, Minn., and have since developed a friendship over their mutual passion of vintage sleds.

"This is his retirement," Van De Berg explained, recalling the first sled he sold to him was a 1971 Eskimo. "He is trying to build up his collection so he can pass it on to his kids. He will probably be buying some more from me."

Another repeat customer is a retired snowmobile dealer from



near Salt Lake City, Utah, who, according to Van De Berg, is on a mission to own a snowmobile from every manufacturer ever made. "At one point, I had 12 of the ones he didn't have in his collection, and he's bought three more since then," he said. "I guess he's a nut like me."

Like his Canadian buddy, Van De Berg also met the Utah dealer at the Waconia event, which is billed as the world's largest vintage snowmobile show and swap meet. For Van De Berg, the ride-in at the southwest Minneapolis suburb becomes a reunion each January. Hay Days each September is another popular venue to make or renew connections, he said.

"The guys I deal with are fellow hobbyists, and in some cases, we've become very close friends," Van De Berg said. "I've been doing it for so long now that people will come up to me at Hay Days or Waconia and tell me they bought a sled from me. That's really neat. You build up a comradery with this vintage market."

#### **Far from Mainstream**

For the most part, Van De Berg collects vintage snowmobiles from 1965 to 1975. He considers anything before that era an antique. He can tell you where each one in his stable came from, and he usually knows the history behind its manufacturer. The rarer the better, he said. There's an occasional Arctic Cat or Polaris, but for the most part, the sleds in his collection are far from the mainstream.

"I'm looking for the oddball stuff," he said. "Some sleds are hard to find, but I've met enough people now that they call me up and

> share where some are at. Other times I find out about a bunch of sleds a family wants to get rid of, and I make them an offer. I've had as many as 45 different brands at once."

> Word-of-mouth helps, but Van De Berg admits his conquest has been aided greatly by

the Internet. As a member of both the Antique Snowmobile Club of America and the Vintage Snowmobile Club of America, he regularly searches their online classifieds for his next big find. He also posts his sleds and related accessories for sale on their free websites.

"You could do this without the Internet but I would not have near as many sleds as I do without it," the 58-year-old confessed. "I really don't care too much for computers, but for what I do, they're great. I wouldn't have three-quarters of the contacts I have right now without it."

The rarest sled Van De Berg has ever owned was a mini snowmobile called a Sno Wolf. Only 50 of those were made, he said, and he owned one for about four years. His current pride-andjoy is an Easy Rider tracked utility vehicle. Originally intended for military use in Viet Nam under the French name Passe Par Tout,

#### Pro Football Influence?

Randy Van De Berg often jokes he could field a professional football league with some of the vintage sleds he's owned over the years. There's been the twin-tracked Raider, a Dauphin with its dolphin logo, a Panther, a Colt and, yes, plenty of Vikings.

Available in five different colors, Viking sleds were manufactured in Twin Valley, Minn., ending production in 1976. Given his close proximity to Minnesota, Van De Berg said he has no problem selling these models, "especially the ones with purple hoods."

300 surplus units ended up in Michigan and were converted to civilian use under the Easy Rider name.

"They had gun mounts on the side, and it steers like a tank—two speeds forward and one reverse," Van De Berg said, simultaneously turning the key in the ignition to highlight its electric start feature. "The Army didn't want them so they were marketed to civilians. I found this one in Wisconsin, and it's all original. Can't be a lot of them left. Occassionally, you find a Passe Par Tout, but this is the only Easy Rider I've ever found."

His latest obsession are Gilson snowmobiles, manufactured by the Gilson Bros. of Plymouth, Wis. This lawn and garden equipment maker also developed snowblowers and eventually snowmobiles in the early 1970s. Snowmobiles manufactured under the Gilson name only lasted three years, which makes them "very rare," Van De Berg noted.

Earlier this year, he bought five Gilsons from a gentleman in Michigan and met him in Gary, Ind., to complete the transaction. Van De Berg estimates he puts on 6,000 miles each year on his pickup, traveling around the country buying and delivering vintage sleds. He recently completed a day-trip through Minnesota and made eight stops along the way, including one for another Gilson machine.

"With gas prices so high, I will try and buy other sleds in the same area," he explained. "I think I put on 952 miles that day alone. By the time I got home, I was tired, but I got the job done."

#### Condition is Everything

According to Van De Berg, most of his picking is done in the Midwest, primarily in Minnesota and Wisconsin, the "mecca of vintage snowmobiles," he calls it. An hour north of Minneapolis at Ogilvie, Minn., he located a 1968 Boatel Ski Bird, while a little closer to home at nearby Sanborn, Minn., he rescued a 1968 Polaris Mustang from a rundown chicken coop.

"The Boatel had a stuck motor, but it was so rare that it really didn't bother me," he said. "The Polaris was a nice little survivor as well. The seat was perfect. You just don't find them like that."

According to Van De Berg, condition is everything, and that

keeps the hunt challenging and exciting. He quickly passes over the "junk" and is only interested in quality finds. To satisfy his criteria, the seat should not be ripped, the hood needs to be intact, and for the most part, the motor needs to at least pull over. A complete windshield is a bonus.

"I'm pretty fussy about what I buy because there's a lot of junk out there," he said. "These sleds are only original once. If it's not a complete sled, I usually don't mess with it unless it's ultra rare. The condition of the seat is also very important. If you find one with a nice seat, you should buy it."

As evidence by the odometer on his pickup, Van De Berg said he will go the extra mile to secure that perfect sled. If he cannot make the trip himself, he can arrange shipping through his network

of contacts, mainly other guys who are already heading to the Midwest for Waconia or Hay Days and can drop the machine off on their way through.

He was able to coordinate delivery of three Harley-Davidson snowmobiles from Oregon this way as well as a 1966 Ski-Daddler from Connecticut. The furthest away he sold a sled was to a collector in the Northwest Territory of Canada near the Alaskan border. "He had heard about my sled collection and bought it from just a picture," Van De Berg said.

#### Stays Busy in the Summer

Van De Berg estimates he spends about nine months out of the year searching for and selling unique, vintage snowmobiles. By the time winter is over, he is usually burned out and spends the springtime recharging his batteries. When summer rolls around again, his interest in the hobby is renewed

"During the summer is usually when I'm on the lookout because you can buy the sleds cheaper then," he said.

Take the time when he was fishing near Aberdeen, S.D., in August of 2013. On their way home, he and his companions noticed a 1968 Ski-Doo Alpine with a single ski and dual track sitting outside at a farm as they passed by. On their return trip this summer, they stopped by the farmhouse to inquire about it.

"I knocked on the door, but the owner wasn't home," he recalled. "The kids gave

me his phone number so I called him up. Not only did he agree to sell it to me, but he offered to bring it down to Sioux Falls for just \$200. It was an offer I couldn't refuse."

Cold-calling comes with the territory and is one of the reasons Van De Berg was initially lured to the hobby. He bought his first vintage sled in 2006 after seeing a 1965 Ski-Doo for sale at Lake Okoboji. "That's where it all got started," he said. "The next day, I bought an Arctic Cat Panther VIP with a cutter, and it just mushroomed from there."


Upon further examination, Van De Berg admits the seed was probably planted a lot earlier than that. As a teenager back in the early 1970s, he worked after school at a Rock Rapids dealership, wrenching on Starcrafts, Sno Jets and Johnson snowmobiles. "That's actually how I got the bug," he said. "I would help set up the new ones and clean up the used ones."

Van De Berg said the hunt for vintage snowmobiles does bring back his childhood "a little bit." Both the Eskimo and the bubble-nose Scorpion he's owned were models he rode as a kid, but like most of his collection, they hold very little sentimental value. He's more interested in making other people's dreams come true and rescuing sleds for posterity.

"Some of my sleds have been super, super rare, and I say I will never get rid of them, but then someone will come along and tell me they had a certain sled as a kid. They will make me a ridiculous offer, and I let it go," he said. "It's then I realize that I'm not married to them *that* much. If I found one,

I can probably find another."

Because he acquires them with very little investment, Van De Berg said he is able to sell his sleds fairly reasonably. He said he's not flipping



"I don't have any money borrowed on any of this. If it gets to a point that I have to borrow money to buy them or if they have to sit outside, I won't buy them," he said, explaining why his collection has grown from a two-stall garage at Okoboji to three buildings on Main Street in Little Rock.

#### No Cure in Sight

Van De Berg has yet to find a cure to his obsession, not that he's looking very hard. He said he gets great satisfaction out of locating that rare machine or completing a fellow hobbyist's collection. He's found a niche in the vintage snowmobile market and fulfills a role few others like him share.

"Nobody else does this around here," he said. "I am probably the farthest out in the realm of vintage snowmbiles involved in this sort of work. You always have to go north or east to find other guys like me."

Valdi Stefanson, president of the Antique Snowmobile Club of America, believes there is a "valuable and legitimate" purpose

> for sled hunters in the vintage world. With new machines costing more than \$10,000, he feels the collector market will continue to grow as an affordable alternative for the sport.

"If this collectors' game is to continue to grow, these individuals are necessary and wanted," said Stefanson, who estimates there have been at least 130 snowmobile manufacturers in the world. "And it will grow so long as future barn finds are discovered and can continue to satisfy the demand out there.

"Quite frankly, guys like (Van De Berg)
elevate the hobby and facilitate new people coming into it. This
hobby has grown though the services of sled hunters," he said.

Van De Berg said he is always on the lookout for that "next great find." If you know of a vintage sled hidden in an outbuilding somewhere, let him know at (712) 261-3941, and he will probably come take it off your hands.

I was reading in Snow Goer magazine a story about a man and his son who got stranded in a blizzard in the U.P. of Michigan. They walked for 22 hours before they were found in 30-below temps. They did not have the things with them to survive the night. They did make it but not without suffering.

I have been out there, and when I got trapped in Idaho, we thought that we were ready to survive a night in the wilderness. I don't think any of us are ready even if we think we are. You will not be ready until it happens to you. First thing I did when I got home from that trip was buy a 12x14-foot tear proof tarp. I have carried it with me since you need it to knock down the wind. All three of my sleds have a 18-inch axe mounted on the tunnel. There are at least three butane lighters in each sled. I carry three gallons of gas with me at all times. You can not believe what a great feeling it is to know that is there. Firewood is hard to find out in the timber under 3-4 feet of snow. You have to find dead trees to cut down

We were in a blizzard with a 40 mile per wind; a tarp would have been a beautiful thing to have. We all have cell phones. My sleds all have cigarette lighters on them and a cord that will fit the lighter so you can charge your cell phone. This we found out about cell phones: Even if you do not have a signal, that call will go through. The line for 911 is for emergencies only, and it may take three or four attempts to get through. Believe me, I have been through this, and I know what I am talking about.

I will be at the ISSA convention in Dubuque in November if you want to talk to me some more about my experiences. The Trailblazers begin meeting this month.
