





Representing the ISSA at Various Functions this Offseason



Pair of Central Iowa Grass Drags Events Planned this Fall

A pair of central Iowa snowmobile clubs are hosting their annual grass drags this fall. The first event is hosted by the Central Iowa Snowmobilers of Region 8 on Sunday, Oct. 25, at the Central Iowa Fairgrounds in Marshalltown. Registration runs from 8 a.m. to 10 a.m. with racing starting promptly at 11 a.m.

According to club secretary Angie Bessman, this year's grass drags will have trophy and payback classes, vintage racing, radar runs and 120 and mini classes for the youth. New to the event this year is ATV drag racing.

The fairgrounds are located at 1308 East Olive Street. Near the track will be a free swap meet, and concessions will also be available on site. The club is planning a 50/50 cash drawing as well. For more information, contact Blake at (641) 485-3161 or Scott at (641) 751-7150.

The second grass drag event reported to the ISSA is the Capital City Shootout, hosted by the Saylorville Dam Snowmobile Club of Region 7. Their races are planned for Saturday, Nov. 7, at Todd's Airfield in Ankeny (Exit 94 off I-35 at 2747 NE 110th Street).

Registration for this event is from 8 a.m. to 10 a.m. Radar runs begin at 9 a.m. with racing starting at 10 a.m. Classes include non-studded stock, trail performance, improved stock and studded trail stock.

120 races are returning this year, and expected to be on hand for the event is club member Aaron Casler with his world record lake racer sled, Black Mamba. Also planning to attend is the Iowa State University Clean Snowmobile Challenge team.

Avalanche Awareness Seminars Coming to Iowa this Preseason

valanche expert Mike Duffy of Eagle, Colo., will return to Iowa this fall to lead a A series of avalanche awareness seminars to interested mountain riders.

The first class will be held Saturday, Oct. 17, at Maverick Powersports in Independence. This four-hour class will teach snowmobilers how to identify risks, how to increase their awareness and how to rescue a fellow snowmobiler trapped in the snow.

"Our classes are taught from a snowmobiler's perspective," Duffy said. "You will learn techniques that work for snowmobilers by an avalanche instructor who has 20 years of mountain riding experience. You will learn how to avoid getting caught in avalanche situations that are inherent to snowmobiling."

The course at Independence starts at 10 a.m. and costs \$49. To sign up, contact Paul at (319) 334-4570 or pbachman@maverickps.com. Participants are encouraged to attend with their riding partners and bring their beacons along.

The remaining four sessions in Iowa are on the new advanced course on "Avalanche Rescue Skills." The first one is Thursday, Nov. 19, at 6 p.m. at Sioux City Yamaha/Can-Am followed by Friday, Nov. 20, at 6 p.m. at House of Sports in Mason City. Both of these classes are sponsored by BRP and free to attend.

Those two sessions are followed by another on Saturday, Nov. 21, at 6 p.m. at McGrath Powersports in Cedar Rapids. There is a \$49 registration fee for this session. The last class currently scheduled in Iowa is at Lake Mills Motorsports 2 in Algona on Thursday, Dec. 3, at 6 p.m. This event is sponsored by the dealer and free to attend.

Poor Snow Results in Registration Decline

The 2014-15 snowmobile season was highlighted by sporadic snowfall followed by what seemed like warm spells and sometimes rain. So when we had measurable snow, it didn't last long. I had more than one in-state snowmobile trip cancelled by rain last year.

The lack of rideable snow and ice negatively impacted the number of miles operated, special events held (fun rides, radar runs, Winter Games, etc.) and lowered registration and user permit numbers.

Last year, county recorders registered 23,858 snowmobiles, and license agents issued 16,233 resident user permits. This is down from the previous year where there were 26,600 snowmobile registrations, and 19,329 resident user permits issued. As a result, snowmobile program revenue at the Iowa Department of Natural Resources (IDNR) mirrored the decline, down about 11 percent.

If you ask a snowmobiler or the general public how the snowmobile program is funded, you will often hear bits-and-pieces of the correct answer. The program is funded by fees from new snowmobile registration, registration renewal, title, lien, user permit and late registration. These varying sources of revenue are impacted by the weather, dealer and person-to-person sales, and the economy.

To supplement this income, the IDNR also applies for National Recreational Trail (NRT) grants through the Recreational Trails Program (RTP). We use these grants to cost-share the purchase of grooming equipment in Iowa. We have been fortunate to receive a number of these grant awards (which comes from federal off-highway gasoline tax apportionments), utilizing \$620,000 in NRT grant funds over the last two seasons.





The program operates with a "revolving fund" type of budget, with revenue not obligated (spent) during the current fiscal year being moved to the next fiscal year, to meet future expenditure needs. At the end of each snowmobile season, the IDNR would like to carry over approximately \$200,000, or

roughly 20 percent, of the annual budget to the next season. This will allow the IDNR to pay for trail signs, preseason repairs and trail liability insurance early in the season, prior to the normal revenue period.

Snowmobile revenue typically begins to increase after Sept. 1, with the biggest revenue months occurring in November, December and January.

We are beginning this fiscal year with a lower than average snowmobile carry-over balance. This is due to Turn to page 8

strong spending on groomer equipment purchases, equipment repairs, ongoing administrative costs and lower than anticipated revenue (mostly due to a lack of good snow conditions).


The IDNR and the ISSA are working in cooperation with snowmobile clubs to prioritize repairs and make purchases that are both necessary and timely with regards to the revenue stream. We are in a good position at the present time to meet our obligations as the season progresses. However, both the IDNR and ISSA are keeping a close eye on registration and user permit numbers as we move into what we hope are the "snowy" season months of December and January.

The IDNR is going to apply for the next round of NRT grant funds for groomer equipment purchases this month. The IDNR is usually notified in January if we have been successful in our grant application, with funds being available for the next fiscal year.

To put things into perspective, all of the progress the snowmobile program has made over the last 10 years to upgrade the groomer fleet, and increase the number of designated trail miles, has been made possible by a combination of club volunteer efforts, club cost-share payments on grooming equipment and wise use of the newly acquired user permit revenue as match with NRT grant funds.

In the program's 40-year history, we have never had more operating groomers and drags on the snow in Iowa or come close to the current 8,800 miles of designated snowmobile trails. This effort will continue into the future, with an eye on both the revenue stream and the weather patterns.

As the program manager, I would like to thank the ISSA and our snowmobile club members for their hard work this last season and in the coming year. Hope to see all of you at convention.

ISSA Looking to Expand Program with Local Club-Sponsored Rides this Winter

Now entering its second decade at this year's gathering, the ISSA is looking to expand upon an existing convention tradition and, in turn, capitalize on the tourism opportunities of snowmobiling in Iowa.

Conceived by ISSA President Merv Hoermann, then Region 1 director, at the 2004 ISSA Convention at West Lake Okoboji, the 'Snowmobile Iowa' promotion has served as a platform for snowmobile clubs from across the state to showcase their trails and promote tourism back home.

2015 ISSA Convention **Preview**

At that first event 11 years ago, 18 clubs participated in the program by individually staffing a booth at convention. Last year, 14 clubs continued the custom at Dubuque, and at this year's convention at King's Pointe Resort in Storm Lake Nov. 20-22, Hoermann—once again chairing the convention in

northwest Iowa—is encouraging clubs to display their wares.

"This is a good opportunity to brag about your trails and your home area to the rest of the snowmobilers in Iowa," Hoermann said. "Who else can better advertise for your region than your own club at convention?"

As listed on the tentative agenda on page 10, the ISSA is now wanting to expand on that concept by encouraging local clubs to host trail rides throughout this winter. A special seminar is being held convention weekend to gauge the interest in this type of event long term.

"What we are looking to do is start a program where all of our clubs are given the opportunity to be a host club once a week throughout the entire snowmobile season," explained Past ISSA President Bruno Andreini. "It would be completely voluntary, but the idea is club members would set a date and then have a group of people who would offer tours of riding the trails in their area."

The Snow Pioneers of Region 5 were one of 14 snowmobile clubs from Iowa to set up a booth at the ISSA Convention and Snow Show in Dubuque last November. 2015 convention organizers are again reminding clubs to showcase their trails and tourism opportunities this year in Storm Lake.

"Of course, where we ride would always be subject to snow availability, and you could even have more than one region hosting events during a given weekend," Past ISSA President Jim Willey added.

The discussion on expanding the Snowmobile Iowa program came on the heels of the ISSA's snowmobile retreat to the Upper Peninsula of Michigan last March. Close to 20 people participated in that event, and in the evening after each day's ride, the group would often get together and share stories of riding in their area back home.

Andreini, who helped organize the U.P. ride, said the interaction among the ISSA members on the trip was "very interesting and productive," and as a result, several thought they should hook up again and ride back in Iowa.

"I have been at this game for longer than most of the people in the ISSA, and I do not know all the trails throughout the state of Iowa, and I doubt if anyone else does either," Andreini said.

By promoting these type of events, he said other riders like himself can learn what other areas of the state have to offer and, in turn, help people stay in Iowa this winter.

"People would get a much better understanding of what's here already. Maybe there's a lot of secrets out there that not everybody knows about," Andreini said. "I really want to see this happen. I think we have so much here to sell and we're not doing a very good job with that.

"With Snowmobile Iowa, we have the perfect opportunity to do that, and it's such a simple thing to do," he continued. "If the ISSA

Season Recap

Marlin Benson Memorial Ride Among Handful of Club Activities to Survive Last Season

Winter Preview

pre-Thanksgiving snowstorm created quite a buzz in the snowmobile community in Iowa last year, but the enthusiasm was short-lived as the winter of 2014-15 ended up a buzzkill for most of the Hawkeve State.

Just about every snowstorm last season was followed by an unwelcomed warm stretch, and snowmobile events across the region were either scrapped or adjusted in the aftermath of the inconsistent and insufficient snowcover.

"We witnessed the impact firsthand last year where clubs which submitted requests for special event permits were either cancelling their plans or changing them," observed David Downing, snowmobile program manager for the Iowa Department of Natural Resources. "I certainly hope we don't see that again this year."

Two traditional snowmobile events in Iowa definitely felt the sting last January. At the Okoboji Winter Games, snowmobile activities were limited to the Kids' Rides in the Polaris factory parking lot; and in the opposite corner of the state, the Driftrunners at Cresco had to suspend its club rides and Torchlight Parade for the 44th Annual SnowFest weekend.

"Last season was definitely a bad year for snowmobiling," lamented Matt Miner, ISSA Region 5 Director and Driftrunners member. "We would get the snow but not the temps to hold it."

The misery spilled over into February as well. The Sac County Snow Lovers in Region 6 spent the first Saturday of the month grooming its trails for a fun run the following day only to have the thermometer reach into the 50s and turn the trails to mush.

In late February, warm weather also forced the Cedar Falls Sno Hawks to cancel its David Carmichael Memorial Ride from Spencer to Cresco. Then to pour salt in the wound, they were greeted a by a tardy snowstorm on what would have been the first day of the three-day ride.

Webster County pulls ride off

Frustrating to say the least, the snowmobile season did have

a few bright spots last winter. The Jack Race on Clear Lake survived the rollercoaster weather pattern the third weekend of January, and on Saturday, Feb. 7—the day before the Sac County club was forced to cancel its event—the neighboring Webster County Ice Breakers club was fortunate enough to host its seventh annual Marlin Benson Memorial Ride. Ice Breakers Club President Jim Suchan said they plan their event each February and keep their fingers crossed that Mother Nature will cooperate.

"We try to set a date each year, but as everyone in Iowa knows, the snow can get pretty iffy any more at that time of year," Suchan said. "We kind of lucked out last season. We booked the date and got enough snow for the event. It did get pretty warm while we were out on the ride, and by the time we got back, the trails had pretty much melted away."

Incorporated in 2010, the Ice Breakers of Region 7 is one of the youngest snowmobile

clubs in Iowa. Local snowmobilers began the memorial ride in 2008 to honor Benson of Gowrie, an avid snowmobiler and local car dealer who passed away shortly after Christmas, 2007, at the age of 51. The ride is the club's primary fundraiser, and last

season's event drew approximately 130 participants.

Money generated by the 70-mile, eight-stop ride benefits the club's \$1,000 annual scholarship to the Southeast Valley High School in Gowrie and also supports the Ice Breakers' contribution to the ISSA Club Challenge. Additional funds are donated to the Namakagon Trail Groomers of Cable, Wis., which Suchan described as their "sister club."

"Those are our three main fundraising efforts, plus keeping our local trails going," Suchan explained. "That is pretty much our goal as a club. We don't need to make a million dollars. We want to keep things going and promote the sport in this area and continue to grow as a club and connect to our neighboring trail systems."

Suchan said the donations and memorial ride serve as a reminder of the contributions Benson made to the area before the club was formed. According to Suchan, "Marlin was very involved in snowmobiling and enjoyed traveling to Wisconsin to ride around Lake Namakagon." In fact, a stretch of trail outside the Pioneer Bar up there is named after him, and the Namakagon club even donated its old drag to the Webster County club a few years back.


Suchan said the memorial ride is the primary reason he and other snowmobilers from the area decided to organize. "We met in my shed about six years ago and decided we should get a club together," he explained. "It kind of snowballed from there."

The date for the 2016 ride will be set later this fall. "We will tentatively plan for a weekend later this winter and then wait and see what the weather will do," Suchan said. "Hopefully, this winter will be better."

Located along snow line

Perhaps one of the reasons the weather in Suchan's region is so unpredictable is they are located along Highway 20, generally accepted as snow line in Iowa. According to state climatologist Harry Hillaker, central and west central Iowa finished the season





at roughly 26 inches of snow last year, equaling the statewide average. North central Iowa received the greatest total last winter at 33 inches, while southwest Iowa finished the season with the least at 16 inches.

Overall, the winter of 2014-15 finished 5.4 inches below the normal average of 32.2 inches and marked the second lowest total in the last nine seasons, surpassed only by the 2011-12 mark of 18.9 inches. Hillaker said last winter ranked in the bottom third of 128 years of snowfall recordkeeping in Iowa, and in fact, the statewide average for December was only 1.5 inches, the 12th lowest total for that same timeframe.

Unlike December, November was unusually cold and snowy with the largest event coming Nov. 15-16. "However, even an unusually cold November typically isn't cold enough to sustain a lasting snow cover despite Des Moines setting a record for the longest duration of sub-freezing temperatures ever during the month of November," Hillaker noted.


According to the Iowa Department of Agriculture, the largest snow event of the winter—and actually the largest single event since the 2009 holiday week—brought a statewide average of 8.5 inches of snow on Jan. 31-Feb. 1. The greatest snow totals with this storm came in central and east central Iowa with 14.7 inches at Madrid and 16.0 inches at Le Claire.

"However, this snow cover was relatively short-lived as temperatures climbed above freezing fairly often starting on Feb. 6," Hillaker said. "There was a period of fairly decent snow cover the first two weeks of January, thanks largely to widespread four to six inch snow amounts on Jan. 5 from northwest to east central Iowa."

Rock Rapids introduced us to ice ovals. Snocross action drew us to Des Moines and Cedar Rapids. Vintage Lemans competition continues to entertain us at Clear Lake, and Marshalltown, Ankeny and others help keep the grass drag tradition alive in the state.

Now, a new color has been added to the crayon box of snowmobile racing in Iowa. This offseason, the Sioux County Snowmobile Club of Region 1 hosted its inaugural Rivers Bend Shootout, a watercross competition sanctioned by the International Watercross Association (IWA).

Held Aug. 21-22 at the city-owned Rivers Bend Campground in Rock Valley, the mix of oval and drag races around buoys on open water featured 47 competitors and drew an estimated 1,000 spectators to the campground's Cabin Cove Pond, a donated 13-acre sand pit near the Rock River.

Billed as the "Fastest Show on H₂O," the northwest Iowa event served as the fifth and final stop on the IWA's circuit. A month earlier, racers had competed in the World Championship at Grantsburg, Wis., and club volunteers in Sioux County were hopeful they could meet the competitors' expectations at their untested venue.

"Going into it, we were all pretty nervous," club member and race organizer Kelly Roder admitted. "We didn't know what to expect, but by Friday afternoon, we were all feeling pretty good about how everything was going. We really didn't have too many hiccups along the way."

"The races went off better than expected," IWA President Shawn Zurn said. "The club went above and beyond my expectations, especially for a first-time event. The community was excellent as well and seemed pretty accepting of this type of snowmobile racing in their area."

ISSA President Merv Hoermann represented the ISSA at the event with the Trail Break trailer and the snowmobile simulator. He too marveled at the response from the community, noting the number of volunteers donning their matching orange T-shirts.

"The main thing I noticed was they had more volunteers than

club members helping out," Hoermann said. "I was impressed. These were just friends of club members doing their part to make this thing work. It just blew me away how much cooperation and support from the community there was that weekend."

Environmentally conscious

As spectators lined the banks of the pond and as a drone filmed the event from overhead, racers launched to the water from the starting gate on the beach at the northeast corner of the shore. Bouys outlined the course, and during the oval racing, racers were making hairpin turns while attempting to keep out of each other's turbulence.

"These guys were good," Hoermann said. "Whoever had the most horsepower usually got the holeshot and the cleaner water,

and whoever was running behind usually got washed up in the wake."

Roder said at least one sled would sink in the water during each race, and to minimize the environmental impact, rescuers would respond quickly. Per IWA rules, each sled is equipped with a marker buoy and tether rope to aid in the recovery process, and all premixed gas is contained in a small, leak-proof tank to prevent water contamination.


"These guys were very environmentally conscious and certainly did not want to be known as polluters," Hoermann said. "Everything is sealed up, and they only put in enough gas for one race. The first thing the riders would do when they went down is kill the motor and grab their rope. A pontoon with an open bow would then come along, straddle the sled and hoist it up. Ten minutes later, the machines were dried out and ready for more action."

While a stock sled could compete on the course, Roder said most of the machines were modified with shorter skis and narrower front suspensions. Rear suspensions, especially in the Pro class, were also adjusted to help the rider "pop up" out of the water faster and navigate the liquid course better, he noted.

"It was pretty exciting to watch," Roder said. "They were coming into the corners basically laying their sled on their sides, and their front skis were completely out of the water. It's unbelievable to see them in action. There's a lot of suspension work to make that happen."

Watercross racing has been around for nearly 40 years with the first event recorded at Grantsburg in 1977. Headquartered in Pine City, Minn., the IWA was formed in 1988, and according to its website, the organization "has remained committed to keeping the level of competition consistent, the rules fair for all participants and ensuring the safety of all attendees."

"I think we offer a form of snowmobile racing that the fan

can enjoy more," Zurn said. "We are extreme and the weather is warm."

Seed planted two years ago


According to Roder, the seed for hosting the races was planted a few years ago at Hay Days. Club members ran into some IWA racers at the annual September show and began corresponding with them and attending their races. One member even signed on as a sponsor for five of the race teams, he said.

Then this past January, as the club learned it was on the short list for a new groomer, members began drumming up fundraising ideas to offset the optional 10 percent club match of the purchase price. It wasn't long before the club agreed to host the watercross event.

"At the time, I didn't know much about this kind of racing," Roder confessed. "I had watched videos of it, but within a month,

As the first hurdle to clear, Roder said he met with the Rock Valley City Council three times before receiving final approval to move forward with the shootout. The club also garnered permission from the Iowa Department of Natural Resources, since two years ago the Iowa Legislature banned recreational snowmobiling on public waters during the offseason.

Club members began planning the event in April and created a Facebook page to help with the publicity. Next, they secured race sponsors, and in July, volunteers converted a pontoon boat into a "sled retriever." To help promote the races, the modified watercraft was entered in the local Rally in the Valley parade in early August. Before long, it was the week of the races, and the call for volunteers rang out.

IWA officials arrived early Thursday to help set up the course, and competitors trickled in throughout the day, some even arriving as late as midnight. Since most of the circuit's racers hailed from Minnesota and Wisconsin, Roder said club members were a little concerned their geographical location in northwest Iowa would hurt attendance. But as club members and hosts of the former ice ovals in neighboring Lyon County can attest, 'If you build it, they will come.'

"Our pond was quite a few hours away from most of these guys, and some were kind of on the fence on whether or not to come since it was a new site," Roder said. "Come Friday morning, however, the racers who did make the trip were texting photos back to their buddies who stayed home. After that, they all wished they had shown up.

"Several of them even commented on our location and how well we had everything set up," Roder added. "There were racers there who had been doing this for 20 years and said this was the best place they had ever raced at. They were blown away by what we were able to put together as first-timers."

Wait 'til next year

In the end, Roder said they were only about 10 racers shy of the predicted turnout. As an incentive to attract competitors to the event, the IWA had coordinated a special drag race shootout that was unique only to the Rock Valley course. By invitation only, 16 top-level racers competed for the \$1,000 purse Friday evening with the winner taking home \$480.


"That shootout was unique to our race and a pretty good payout for just one event," Roder said. "For the watercross racers, that's pretty sizeable take-home money to offset their expenses."

For the balance of the weekend's slate, racers competed in heats and finals across eight classes, accruing points for the seasonending championship. Trophies for the Rivers Bend event were handed out Saturday night with Brian Mccurdy of Lindstrom,

Minn., winning the Pro Open class. He was also the season points champ in that category as well.

Roder said the club met "80 percent" of its goals for its inaugural race. They plan on spreading the word about next year's race with a presentation at the ISSA convention in Storm Lake in November. They readily admit they still have some work to do in order to come up with the funds to match their share of a new groomer.

"2015 was a learning year for us, figuring out what worked, what didn't and looking to see what we can improve on for next summer," Roder said. "You always wish you made more money, but we ended up with more than what we started with so it was a successful event. I would call that a win. Now with a year under our belt, we are looking ahead to 2016 to see what we can do to make it better. Next year will be a good time for sure."

inches of snow to the northeast half of Iowa on Feb. 25. Bitter cold air followed immediately after this late February storm but quickly dissipated as temperatures rapidly warmed along the southwest fringe of this snow area on March 6.

The only other major snow event of the winter came on March 23 and impacted only far northeast Iowa with 12 inches at McGregor. "However, as is typical of latewinter events, temperatures did not remain low enough, long enough, to preserve this snowcover for very long," Hillaker said.

As for this coming winter, a strong El Nino event is expected to persist. Typically, El Nino patterns bring above normal temperatures to the northern U.S. and southwestern Canada from December into March. In Iowa, fortunately, snow totals in El Nino winters have no pronounced tendency, i.e. below normal snowfall is just as common as above normal.

"However, we do seem to get more snow than usual in the 'fringe' season of October-November and March-April, when typically higher temperatures make it very unlikely that snowcover will stick around for very long," Hillaker said.

Since 1982-83, Iowa has endured 10 El Nino events. Most of them have produced milder weather, but the last one in 2009-10 was unusually cold and snowy. Much to every snowmobiler's delight, that season produced the highest snowfall total in the past 15 years with a statewide average of 49.2 inches.

"Thus, having an El Nino event, even a strong one, doesn't guarantee a mild winter," Hillaker said.
