
## Central Iowa Grass Drags Move to Grundy Center Oct. 26

The Central Iowa Snowmobilers of Region 8 will be hosting its annual grass drags I on Saturday, Oct. 26, at a new location at the Grundy County Fairgrounds in Grundy Center. The club previously held its drags at the fairgrounds in Marshalltown.

Club president Blake Matney reported on the club's Facebook page in late August that the "new facility is coming along nicely. The track surface is very flat, and it already has a lot of grass growing on it. The track will be the same length as what we had in Marshalltown but much smoother."

Registration begins at 8 a.m. on race day and lasts for two hours. No late entries will be accepted, and racing begins promptly at 11 a.m. Radar runs will begin at 9 a.m. Classes include Trail Stock, Trail Stock Unstudded, Trail Performance, Improved Stock and Pro Stock.

Specialty classes include Vintage Liquid, Vintage Air, Improved Stock Shootout, King of the Track, King of the Trail, ATVs and Side-by-Sides. The club also plans youth racing in the 120 Class and for 13-17-year-olds. A free snowmobile and ATV swap meet will also be held on the grounds.

# Arctic Cat Breaks Silence, Quells BUMOIS AT HAV DAVE PRESSAT

To say it has been a tumultuous and uncertain time since Textron purchased Arctic Cat in March of 2017 for the Thief River Falls manufacturer would be an understatement.

Over the past six months, the brand has undergone significant changes, including the announcement of 2020 models being available as spring order only; rumors of significant cutbacks in racing; and the closing of nearly 300 dealerships across North America.

With so much change happening, rumors of another sale—or worse yet, the shuttering of the Arctic Cat snowmobile brand— had enthusiasts and dealers alike questioning the brand's future. To make matters worse, communication from Arctic Cat or Textron was near radio silence.


However, at Hay Days this year, core members of the snowmobile media huddled inside the Arctic Cat race trailer as Craig Kennedy, vice president of Arctic Cat, looked to "clear the air" and open up new lines of communication not only with the media, but with dealers and customers alike.

"I want to try to put many of these rumors to bed," Kennedy said after admitting the company had done a poor job of communicating to this point. "We've made a lot of changes with how we're doing business, and that creates a lot of questions. Honestly, we are just trying to concentrate on running a great business and trying to get back to a profitable business."

Kennedy also specifically addressed changes to the dealer network, and while he couldn't speak to those dealers who the company decided not to continue a business relationship with, he felt strongly

> about the network that remains.

> "I can tell you the dealer network we are standing with now is super strong...and they are super capable. needed We make some changes in how we as a company operate. Our spring Snowmageddon

Kennedy also wanted to assure everyone, Arctic Cat is going to stay on the gas when it comes to product development.

"What I will tell you is we are not going to win by following the same business model that we've always done," Kennedy said. "We're going to change the way we go about things. Snowmageddon was just the star.

"This winter, we're going earlier (with new 2021 product) than we ever have. We're not stepping down. We're putting our foot on the gas and creating new products that will lead the industry."

## 2020 Convention Host Sought by ISSA Board

**B**ids to host the 2020 ISSA Annual Convention are due to the ISSA Board of Directors this month. With no regular board meeting planned for October, clubs should submit bids to their respective region directors.

Ideally, the winning bid will be announced at the conclusion of the 2019 ISSA Convention, held next month, Nov. 22-24, at the Pzazz Convention and Event Center in Burlington. See pages 8-11 for more on this year's event.

The ISSA began rotating convention sites after its 40th Anniversary celebration in 2013 in Altoona. The logic behind the move was to bring conventions closer to members and snowmobilers in each region of lowa. Board members hoped the reduced travel time would increase attendance locally.

The rotation moves from west to east. This year's convention should have been located in central lowa, but when no bids were submitted by the deadline last fall, the ISSA board accepted the Southeast Iowa Ridge-Blasters' offer to host, and the site leapfrogged to Burlington.

Here are the convention host sites since the rotation began: Altoona (2013), Dubuque (2014), Storm Lake (2015), Waterloo (2016), Cedar Rapids (2017), Spirit Lake (2018) and Burlington (2019).

# Talking Policy, Developing Strategy at Off-Season Gathering in Michigan

strong delegation of Iowa snowmobil-Aers represented the ISSA at the 51st Annual International Snowmobile Congress in Grand Rapids, Mich., June 5-8. The 2019 event was hosted by the Michigan Snowmobile Association at the Amway Grand Hotel and Conference Center.

Congress is an event dedicated to the development of strategies on international snowmobilers' common role with respect to the environment, conservation, access, education and accountability. It is also a perfect opportunity for networking in the snowmobile community and to establish relationships with key snowmobile leaders.

The annual gathering also allows representatives from national snowmobile organizations and representatives from the state and provincial snowmobile organizations to meet jointly as the International Snowmobile Council. This assembly is dedicated to promoting safe and responsible snowmobiling and provides a communication forum on a global scale.

Many reports and updates relevant to snowmobiling are given at the series of meetings, and the International Snowmobile Manufacturers were pleased to report that snowmobile sales in North America continued to show a positive growth pattern in the past year and that snowmobile sales outperformed the U.S. and Canadian

Snowmobiling is a significant recreation of choice and a major economic contributor throughout the U.S., Canada, Scandinavia and Russia. It's estimated that snowmo-



biling contributes more than \$30 billion of economic activity in North America alone.

Snowmobiling is not without its howchallenges, ever, and many of

these challenges were discussed at the four days of meetings and social activities. All of this was accomplished in a setting that offers fun, entertainment, good food, exceptional lodging and a unique "off-site" experience while taking care of the business of snowmobiling.

Chapter meetings with the American Council of Snowmobile Associations (ACSA) included updates on snowmobile access and grooming, lawsuits, workshops on increasing membership and connecting with local media. Yours truly was elected to the executive council of ACSA.

Also taking advantage of the meeting rooms were members of the Canadian Council of Snowmobile Organizations (CCSO), the International Snowmobile Media Council (ISMC), the Department of Natural Resources representatives and

snowmobile program administrators.

A new organization in the snowmobile community was also in attendance. The United Snowmobile Alliance, Inc, states its purpose to be the preservation and promotion of environmentally-responsible organized snowmobiling and the creation of safe and sustainable snowmobiling in the

The 52nd Annual International Snowmobile Congress will take place June 10-13, 2020, in Regina, Saskatchewan. Omaha is next in 2021, and the ISSA has applied to host in 2022. The inaugural ISC was held in 1969 in Albany, N.Y., and 25 other states have hosted the annual event since then. Iowa has twice hosted the event: 2010 at Coralville and 1995 at Cedar Rapids.

## **New Location for Spina** Bifida Walk-N-Roll Oct. 12

The Spina Bifida Association of Iowa, the ISSA's official charity since 1982, will be holding its annual Walk-N-Roll fundraiser at Terra Park in Johnston on Saturday, Oct. 12. Registration opens at 1 p.m., and the walk starts at 2:30 p.m.

Past ISSA President Bruno Andreini of Dallas Center serves as the ISSA's liaison on the SBAIA board and is encouraging ISSAmember clubs to enter a team to participate in this year's event.

"We seem to have the same three or four people represent the ISSA at this function, so it would be nice to have others from around the state come down and help raise money for our favorite charity," Andreini said.



The Walk-N-Roll is one of SBAIA's premier fundraising events. Families and sponsors form teams to collect pledges and donations and then report their totals after the walk. Prizes and awards are expected to be announced at around 3 p.m.

"The name "Walk-N-Roll" was selected because it embodies a sense of inclusiveness and invokes the sense of empowerment which the spina bifida community embraces in all that it does," according to a post on the SBAIA's website. "A belief in a better tomorrow is our vision and the steps taken in this walk represent steps on a path to realizing that

"I guess I want everyone to know this is a family event. It's not just for the guys," Dorothy said. "With Christmas right around the corner, we are going to have an awesome lady come in and bring everything to make cute holiday wreaths.

"This will be at the same time as the groomer class," he continued. "So while the guys are off doing their thing, the ladies will be able to go sit, relax, make a wreath and enjoy some wine. Call it a wreath, wine and unwind if you will, but this will be a fun event for them to do!"

Trail Readiness Clinic as well as a Youth Social Hour complete with go-cart racing. Dorothy oversees the ISSA's youth program, Kids Intentionally Supporting Snowmobiling (KISS), and is looking for the younger generation to take the lead on these activities at convention.

"This is for the youth by the youth," he said. "The class is just going to be some simple things to look for, ideas that they might like and some pointers. And the fun part about it is, it will be taught by their peers. We are also hoping to have some virtual reality goggles available for the kids to try out with a couple of 360-degree snowmobile views."

Dorothy said he is looking for sponsors to help offset the expenses from the youth activities as well as a little extra money to buy the kids special take-home gifts. General convention sponsors are also still needed to cover costs above and beyond what registration fees cover. See page 11 for sponsorship opportunities.

"If any individual or club is willing to help out, it would be greatly appreciated," Dorothy said.

Updated convention information is also available on page 11. In addition to the groomer operator class, Saturday afternoon seminars will include information on trail mapping through the Polaris RideCommand app plus a financial health update on the ISSA's Snowmobile Trail Grant Program.

Another seminar expected at convention is a planning session for Snowmobile Iowa, a trail ride spin-off from the club booths at convention by the same name. Here, local clubs volunteer to host rides and invite snowmobilers from across Iowa to tour their trail systems.

Six weekends in January and February are typically selected for the rides, and clubs sign up to host on a first-come, first-served basis. If enough interest exists, this season will be the fourth consecutive year the ISSA has attempted to organize trail rides.

Due to poor snow and trail conditions, more events have been cancelled than held in the three-year history of Snowmobile Iowa, but ride coordinator and Past ISSA President Bruno Andreini isn't discouraged enough to not make another attempt at it this year.

"We haven't had the greatest success at these rides in the past, but I'm still willing to get together and see if can make something happen again this winter," he said.

Beginning with a statewide map this month, four trail maps will be printed in the center spread of this magazine over the next four issues. Be sure to hang onto each in case a Snowmobile Iowa ride is planned for that particular area.




This year's convention site is just north of the Highway 61/34 interchange in Burlington.

## ISU Team Competes in Fifth Straight Clean Snowmobile Challenge in March

In his youth, Ryan Greeley said he used to tinker in his parents' basement workshop in their suburban Minneapolis home. but it wasn't until he enrolled at Iowa State University in Ames more than three years ago that he was really able to start getting his hands dirty.

Shortly after arriving on campus, the Mechanical Engineering major from Minnetonka joined the Engineering Department's Clean Snowmobile Challenge team, and by his junior year, he had risen to the position of project director. His fingernails have never looked the same since.

"Working on this project has given me a ton of hands-on experience," the Cyclone senior said. "Coming into college, I hadn't had any exposure to automotives or mechanics. I took care of some little projects growing up but never had any experience working on cars or snowmobiles.

"Working with this team has really helped me understand engines and exhaust systems and has given me a chance to work with different power tools that I have never used before," he added.

For the 2018-19 campaign, Greeley led a team of 14 engineering students who volunteered to build a snowmobile for the Clean Snowmobile Challenge (CSC) at Michigan Tech University (MTU) in the Upper Peninsula (UP). Last March was the fifth consecutive year ISU had fielded a team for the SAE competition.

Each season, the team-known as Cy-Snowmobile Engineering—has entered into the Internal Combustion category and has achieved varying degrees of success. In 2015, their first year, the group finished eighth and earned Rookie of the Year honors. They followed up that notable performance with a sixth-place finish in 2016.

But the team was dealt a huge blow in 2017, when their sled caught fire during competition, and they were unable to finish. Deflated but not defeated, the team recovered for an 11th-place finish in 2018 and, earlier this year, rebounded to an eighth-place finish among 21 teams.

"We'd all love to win," Greeley admitted. "Everyone's goal is to finish first, but this is a very rigorous competition so if you are able to show up and compete in every single event and get a score in every event, you're doing pretty well."

### **Inspiring Students for 20 Years**

The Clean Snowmobile Challenge was created in 1999 in response to snowmobile access issues in Yellowstone National Park. After an initial start at West Yellowstone,



the competition relocated to the UP's Keweenaw Peninsula 17 years ago.

The contest is designed to pro-

mote ingenuity, improve snowmobile technology and reduce the sport's environmental footprint. Besides internal combustion engines, students representing colleges from across the Snow Belt also compete with diesel utility and electric engines.

The rules are strict, and during the weeklong marathon, snowmobiles are judged on—among other measures—emissions, fuel economy, acceleration, cold-starting, endurance and horsepower. Teams are expected to arrive to the competition ready for testing and riding.

Jay Meldrum, director of the Keweenaw Research Center (KRC) at Michigan Tech, coordinates the event each year, and while scoring is necessary, the spirit of the competition is for students to learn leadership skills and to contribute to the future of the sport of snowmobiling.

"It is the educational journey that they take, not their final placement, that is important to me," Meldrum said. "They learn a ton each year."

Greeley agreed. Besides acquiring mechanical skills he never knew he had, he said the CSC experience has been invaluable for his professional growth and career goals.

"Understanding the team dynamic and working with different individuals, that's really helped me with my plans after college," he said.

Before heading up the team last season, Greeley said he hadn't had too many opportunites to learn such skills as time management, fundraising and organizational leadership.

"I had never led an organization, had never reached out to sponsors and never put presentations together on a weekly basis," he said. "But with this team, I always had to look at the big picture. It wasn't just about what are we going to accomplish this week, but what are we going to accomplish this week and four weeks after to be ready in two months."

## **Always Looking for Sponsors**

Greeley said fundraising is critical to the success of the program. He said the team's annual budget fluctuates between \$10,000 and \$13,500. Buying parts eats up a lot of the money as the team tries new technology to improve their performance. Travel and lodging expenses at the competition also consume a chunk of their funding.

Team members raise money when and where they can. At the Iowa-Iowa State football game Sept. 14, they staffed a concession stand inside Jack Trice Stadium for nearly 12 hours during the

weather-lengthened event.

In the past, the ISSA and a number of snowmobile clubs in Iowa have donated time and money to the team, and at the competition in Michigan each year, Past ISSA President Merv Hoermann volunteers at the week-long event.

By far, though, the Saylorville Dam Snowmobile Club has been the team's largest benefactor, contributing financially as well as lending technical support to the students. As a test-n-tune session for the CSC competition, the team has participated in the club's annual fall grass drags in Ankeny.

New this year, the Saylorville club has issued a challenge to other clubs in the state to help raise money for the ISU team. As detailed in the adjacent story, the Region 7 club will match up to \$500 in donations to bankroll the students. Club president Barry Starmer said it's important to support the young engineers.

"This team is working hard to make snowmobiling more environmentally-friendly, and through their testing, they are helping to make engines more efficient," he said.

Greeley said he appreciates any support they can get.

"We are an all student-ran and funded organization," he said. "It's crucial for us to have a healthy budget because of our expenses, so fundraising is everything. Without it, we wouldn't be able to compete."

For the last few years, the Saylorville Dam Snowmobile Club (SDSC) of Region 7 has had the pleasure of starting and growing a relationship with the ISU Engineering Department's Clean Snowmobile Challenge team.

This group of ISU students started as a small group scratching together a used Polaris 800 and innovating to squeeze as much as possible out of this machine, improving fuel mileage, reducing emissions, not exceeding the maximum HP requirements, etc. That first year they

met great success, earning 'Rookie Team of the Year' honors.

As the years clicked on, Polaris donated another sled to the team, a 600 this time, giving them another chance to come up with creative ways to improve on efficiency and performance with a smaller power-plant. Unfortunately, that sled suffered a fire during competition and they were unable to finish.

That setback didn't slow down this group of ambitious students. Instead, they went back to their previous sled and went way outside the box with an engine swap, switching out the 800 for a turbocharged 750 4-stroke.

This engine swap was just the beginning of the innovations which included Custom Stainless Steel Exhaust, Standalone ECU, Dual Cooling System, 3-D Printed Instrument Panel, 3-D Printed Down-pipe, 3-D Printed Quarter Turns, Graphite Hyfax, LED headlights, and a Custom Sled Wrap (which we all know makes more HP and better fuel economy automatically).

They then were able to get their hands on an Arctic Cat 4-stroke sled and continued to work on innovations in the areas of ECU,

exhaust and, of course, performance, topping out at 123 hp (just 7 hp shy of the maximum limit).

Throughout this process, the SDSC has been fortunate to be the local club to help support these students as they work to further develop the sport of snowmobiling, both on the technical development side and the outreach side—displaying their snowmobiles at the Science center of Iowa, participating in the ISU car show and making a showing at the SDSC's annual grass drags.

The SDSC's support for the ISU Clean Snowmobile team has come in the form of an open door to come to our meetings and update us on the current state of the project, a policy they graciously returned, inviting us to tour their shop last December. The SDSC also had been fortunate to be able to offer some technical advice through discussions with a few of our members who are involved with snowmobile racing. The last pillar of support for the ISU team, of course, has come on the financial side, with the SDSC sponsoring the team for the last several years.

The SDSC would like to increase the financial support of this wonderful group of students by starting an ISSA-wide challenge. In addition to our normal sponsorship of the ISU team, the SDSC would like to present the ISSA clubs with the challenge of raising money to support the ISU team.

To encourage this fundraising, and help them better compete against teams with much deeper pockets, the SDSC will match up to \$500 total for donations made to the team. That means that if five clubs each donate \$100 to the ISU team, or if the ISSA is able to raise \$1000 as a whole, SDSC will also donate an additional \$500. Either way, the ISU team will be better off as will the sport of snowmobiling as we encourage younger participants to enter snowmobiling.





## Okoboji Club Grateful for Help from Near and Far Last Season

Around 2 p.m. Saturday afternoon, Jeremy and Kayla arrived with the new set of tracks! We appreciated this offer so much, we decided to put them up in a local hotel, so they could get to see our lovely area—and ride with us the next day!

With the groomer needing to be thawed out, no repairs could be made until this happened. All was going well for Kevin as he made good time getting across Clay County so he could start on our trails. By 7 p.m., more than 65 miles were done, and the planned club ride route was complete.

Everyone was up bright and early for breakfast and the club ride on Sunday. It was a great day. There was a great turnout by club members and family members. It was a huge day for all the businesses in the area, as every place we stopped to support our sponsor was very busy with snowmobiles. We even got a chance to ride with our new friends, Jeremy and Kayla, who brought us the tracks.

Repairs to the groomer started Monday morning, and by early afternoon, our machine was back on the job making trails. Special thanks to Brady Parks, Jason Carney, Randy Magg and Kevin Winters for making the repairs and to Rob Tvedte for the warm shop to make the repairs.
