I can relate to both of them. As we work with the Iowa Department of Natural Resources

the state snowmobile program over to the ISSA, we are getting the team together and making plans to make sure we keep the ISSA and the snowmobile program going for many years to come.

Effective July 1, 70 percent of all snowmobile registrations and trail pass funds will be retained on the local side of the snowmobile program. This means more money back to the clubs to use to maintain, sign and groom trails.

Along with this change in funding, there is a transfer of administrative duties. The administrative responsibilities are switching from the IDNR to the ISSA. This transfer is being handled through a contract between the IDNR and ISSA.

To carry out the administrative duties, we have established a new Review and Selection Committee (RSC). This is a group with equal representation across the state. More information on the RSC has been emailed to all ISSA members, is on the ISSA website and in this issue of the Iowa Snowmobiler.

The RSC is responsible for overseeing and carrying out the administration of the snowmobile program. This includes club grants, trail sign orders and groomer operation and purchases. The RSC held its first meeting on July 18th. The club grants were reviewed and approved, and clubs will receive their grant award letters in the coming weeks.

Last January in this column, I said, "I have assembled a team of past presidents and region directors to work on a legislation package for some changes to the snowmobile program." I am proud to report we accomplished almost all of those changes in the Iowa Code for the snowmobile pro-

With the ISSA now in charge of the pro-

gram, it is my goal to work with the Emergency Funding and Legislative Committee (EFC) and the ISSA board to set up a detailed standard operating procedure for the RSC and clubs to go by. These procedures will be developed using the Iowa code for snowmobiling in chapter 47 as a guideline.

These policies have been in place for a long time, and I don't see a need to reinvent the wheel, but there are some things I have identified that need to change. I want the program under the RSC to have a quicker turn around on groomer repairs, better communication to all snowmobilers, and

easier for clubs to get that help.

In the coming months, the ISSA will be working on getting these changes in place. We will be sending out updates on the new processes in all forms of correspondence. We will also have a full seminar and Q&A session at the ISSA convention in Novem-

There was one part of our Legislation package that we were not able to get done. The combining of the registration and trail pass stickers into one registration sticker for Iowa residents. As I have visited club meetings and talked to dealers, the majority of Iowa snowmobilers want this change.

We did receive opposition from some snowmobilers who say they don't ride in Iowa and don't want to have to pay more in registration. If you want to have only one sticker on your sled, I encourage you to talk to your fellow snowmobilers and legislators. Explain to them why you want the change. We will be looking into this for legislation this year and will be looking for membership input.

With all these new changes, it will take time to get everything set up. I ask everyone for some patience and understanding. We will have 100 percent transparency where our registration funds are being spent. Having sustained funding for the clubs that is easily applied for is of utmost importance

If you or someone you know has questions or your club would like me to attend their meeting to answer questions, please contact me, and I would be glad to answer questions and attend your club meeting. I look forward to seeing everyone in Cedar Rapids for convention and on the trails this

# Fa S Partie

Towa snowmobilers once again flew Lto Washington, D.C., last spring to participate in the American Council of Snowmobile Associations' (ACSA) D.C. Fly-In, an annual pilgrimage to the nation's capitol to bring awareness to issues affecting snowmobiling and public access.

Arriving in town on April 22 for three days of meetings, the Iowa delegation included ISSA President Chris Willey, ISSA Vice President Brian Carmichael, Past ISSA President Jim Willey and ISSA Eastern Iowa Tourism Chair Becky Willey.

Also participating from Iowa was Bob King of Council Bluffs, former chair of ACSA's Midwest Chapter and a longtime ACSA supporter. Jim Willey is also a former vice chair of the Midwest Chapter. The Iowa contingent was among 65 snowmobilers from 16 states across the Snow Belt who participated in the event.

Completing its 18th year, the Fly-In featured guest speakers, updates from various federal agencies and presentations by friends of snowmobiling in the political arena. Congressional staffers and more than 200 Senators and Representatives were also visited by the group on Capitol Hill.

According to ACSA Executive Director Christine Jourdain, topics ranged from

continued funding for the Recreational Trails Program (RTP), national monument designations, wilderness area designations, concerns over endangered species and budget priorities. U.S. Forest Service Chief Tom Tidwell was among the guest speakers.

"It was an exciting time to be in D.C. that week as the Secretary of Agriculture was confirmed and President Trump introduced a review of national monuments that have been established over the last 21 years." Jourdain said.

"When most people hear the word 'monument', they likely think of a statue of a general on a horse or something like that, but a 1906 law allows the federal government to designate land as a national monument and take control of it away from the states," Jim Willey explained.

For instance, as he was leaving office, President Obama, Willey said, "infuriated" Utah officials by designating more than a million acres in Utah as a "national monument." According to an ISSA press release, the Obama Administration, over its years in office, designated close to 265 million acres of land under this act.

"Trump's actions provided a muchoverdue correction," Willey said. "While some federal protection Turn to page 6

# Communications Committee Announces Magazine Change

The ISSA Communications Committee has assumed the role of publisher of the Iowa Snowmobiler magazine following a seven-year run in that capacity by Cameron Hanson of Charles City.

Due to declining advertising revenue, Hanson informed the ISSA Board of Directors in August of 2016 he would not be renewing his contract as publisher beyond the 2016-17 season. At last month's board meeting, he agreed to remain as editor of the magazine for his 18th consecutive year. He will also continue to oversee the ISSA's website at www.iowasnowmobiler.com.

For the second straight year, only one of the four snowmobile manufacturers has committed to support the ISSA's official publication through advertising. Other long-time backers have also pulled away due to budget cuts, thus putting the responsibility of covering the costs of the magazine back on the association.

At the August board meeting, the ISSA agreed to producing, printing and mailing all seven issues of the magazine and hopes to cover those expenses through ad sales and fundraising efforts. All issues of the magazine will also be available online on the ISSA's website.

According to Chair Jim Willey, the communications committee has once again partnered with Minneapolis-based publisher MSPN to help in that sales endeavor. The ISSA will also be promoting its Platinum Sponsorship program, as printed on the inside cover of this month's issue.

"Club support is vital to the success of our magazine," Willey said. "Last season's ISSA Magazine Maker fundraiser for the magazine will now be replaced with the ISSA encouraging snowmobile clubs to become Platinum Sponsors of the ISSA at a special club rate of \$350, a commitment of just \$50 per issue.

"The regular rate for businesses and associate Platinum Sponsors will remain at \$500," Willey continued. "If clubs choose to provide a lesser amount to support the magazine, as always, any amount is appreciated. We are also counting on clubs to contact their local dealers, motels, restaurants, gas stations and other businesses to become Platinum Sponsors."

From page 5 of wilderness may be necessary for conservation, this law has become less about protecting national monuments than it is a monument to federal government overreach and the hubris of Washington bureaucrats."

The Iowa delegation brought this message

to Iowa Sens. Joni Ernst and Charles Grassley as well as to other staffers during their visit to D.C. and "encouraged them to support the efforts to put the control of these millions of acres back into the hands of the states and the local stakeholders. where it belongs," Willey said.


# Former Region 12 Director Jim Pickle Passes Away in August

Former Region 12 Director Jim Pickle passed away Aug. 3 at his home in Mount Pleasant. He was 83 years old.

For close to 20 years, Jim served on the ISSA board as either a director or as an assistant. He was first elected in 1994 and retired in 2012.

He was a founding member of the Southeast Iowa Ridge-Blasters snowmobile club in Region 12 and remained active in the club for more than 35 years.

Jim and his wife, Ann, were regular supporters of the ISSA, attending several summer campouts and the annual convention each fall, often earning the "farthest travelled" distinction at most events.



In addition to snowmobiling, Jim's interests included hunting, fishing and camping. Having served in the Navy during the Korean War, he was a lifetime member and former commander of the local Veterans of Foreign Wars post.

Formerly of New London, he was self-employed as a mechanic for more than 30 years, He later worked for the lowa Army Ammunition plant and Metromail before helping out with his son's business. His obituary noted he was a diehard Hawkeyes and Packers fan as well.

"It is with heavy hearts that we have to say good-bye to Jim," posted Ridge-Blasters treasurer and current Region 12 director Aaron Dorothy on the club's Facebook page. "Jim was instrumental in promoting and supporting snowmobiling not just in southeast lowa but in the entire state...He was a great influence to me personally and a number of other members."



Each day during the coming winter season, the National Park Service will allow up to five snowmobiles in each of four non-commercially guided transportation snowmobile trips from each of the four Yellowstone Park gates.

Those select riders will be required to possess a non-commercial snowmobile access permit which will be awarded annually through an online lottery system. The lottery located at the www.recreation. gov website started on Sept. 1 to determine the trip dates for non-commercially guide leaders wanting to visit Yellowstone this winter. The lottery will remain open until Sept. 30.

After the lottery is finished and the initial trips are awarded (only one trip from the lottery), snowmobilers can still sign up to lead a trip or a second trip at www. recreation.gov on a first-come-first-served basis for the dates still available. Note these remaining dates will be available in mid-October.

Finally, a total of only two trips allowed per season per non-commercial guide are allowed. The trips can last up to three days, and each day of the permit will cost the rider \$40.

Each snowmobile operator will be required to have successfully completed the Yellowstone Snowmobile Safety Education Certification training course. The training course is available online. This course was developed with the help and sponsorship of the Wyoming State Snowmobile Program and is available at no cost at the following website: http://provalenslearning.com/yellowstone-snowmobile-education-certificate.

Lastly, snowmobilers will be required to use only current Best Available Technology (BAT) snowmobiles in their group. Note these required machines can be rented at the location near the four gates.

# Eye Toward the Future

## Landmark Legislation Paves Way for Additional Trail Funding

espite significantly increasing their workload, seasoned volunteers on the ISSA Board of Directors are touting the passage of landmark legislation this year that will ultimately expand snowmobile trail funding in Iowa and preserve the sport, they feel, for years to come.

Unanimously passed by the Iowa Legislature and signed into law by then-Gov. Terry Branstad on April 12, the new legislation increases the share of snowmobile registration receipts for the local club side, shifts administration of the state snowmobile program to the ISSA and transfers ownership of the groomer fleet to the nonprofit organization.

"We feel these changes will ensure Iowa snowmobilers will have trails to ride on well into the future," ISSA President Chris Willey said. "It provides an opportunity to give control back to the user group as well as ensure complete transparency of snowmobile program funds. This transition was made possible by a lot of dedicated people, and for that, I am grateful.'

"I think this is a major step forward for increasing recreational opportunities here in Iowa," ISSA Lobbyist Mike Heller added. "It demonstrates how dedicated Iowa snowmobilers are to responsibly increasing and maintaining trails here in Iowa. Given the fiscal condition of the state now, this legislation is even more important to preserving our trail system."

Under the new law, 70 percent of the annual snowmobile registration receipts will be earmarked for snowmobile trail grooming, maintenance and improvements. Previously, only 50 percent of those dollars was set aside for snowmobile club grants, with the Iowa Department of Natural Resources (IDNR) retaining the other half for program administration, law enforcement, education and insurance.

Moving forward, the ISSA will enter into a cooperative agreement with the IDNR where the daily tasks of the program will

limited. Among other duties, the agency will continue to collect snowmobile registration fees, work with county recorder offices and provide code enforcement in the field.

IDNR Snowmobile Education Coordinator Rhonda Fowler will remain in her support position, while former program manager Randy Schnoebelen will return full time to his supervisory duties in District 2.

"A large part of the day-to-day operations of the program is now going to be the responsibility of the association," Fowler said. "We see this as an opportunity for your members to have a more active role in the program. We look forward to working cooperatively with them to continue to make the program successful."

"One thing we've always prided ourselves on is working with the IDNR and not against them," Past ISSA President Terry Durby said. "We have always been partners in this whole thing. Part of our job has always been to help administer the program. When it came time this year to make the serious changes in the percentages and to transfer the equipment, they seemed receptive to it. I'm really happy we were able to work with them, and they will continue work together with us."

#### Changes to Review and Selection Committee

For more than 40 years, the ISSA and the IDNR have worked in tandem on dispersing trail grant funds to clubs with the latter having the final say on where the money goes and how it is spent. Now, that responsibility belongs to the ISSA with the IDNR having some input through its cooperative agreement. Fowler will act as a liaison between the two groups.

Fowler will also serve as the IDNR's lone representative on the Review and Selection Committee (RSC). This group meets each off-season to grade trail grant applications from Iowa snowmobile clubs and to determine how much money will be awarded to each. Previously, the committee was comprised of three state officials and two ISSA volunteers. Under the new arrangement, the committee has been expanded to include a larger representation of Iowa snowmobilers.

Willey, who also manages the groomer operator training program for the state, will serve in an administrative role on the RSC, as will Durby, a long-term RSC member. Both will fill permanent spots on the board. Five other positions will have term limits of either two or three years. See the table at left for this season's make-up.

The ISSA president (or his appointee, in this case) will hold a seat as will the office of vice president. Three other positions were created to maintain representation from the east, central and western portions of the state. Appointed for this year, those three positions will be elected at their respective annual ISSA conventions beginning in 2018.

"The intent of the RSC election and appointment process was to provide continuity, geographic representation, accountability and what is best for the snowmobile trail grant program," Willey explained in an update to clubs in August.

The RSC met July 18 in Story City to review and approve club grant applications for the upcoming season. Committee members based their decisions on conservative revenue projections from last season's total. The committee won't know the exact dollar amount they are working with until the cooperative agreement is signed by the IDNR. Once that happens, the ISSA will be able to share award amounts with the individual clubs.

"We based those grant award amount decisions off of last year's registration and user permit numbers. We did this so we would make sure we could cover what was awarded to the clubs and not have a shortfall," Willey explained. "I want to remind everyone that before we can officially award those grant amounts, we need to know what we have for dollars in the snowmobile program and have the contract signed and in place."

In addition to trail grant awards, the ISSA's cut of the revenue also needs to cover trail liability insurance, equipment insurance and sign orders. During the decision-making process, committee members followed closely the same criteria as during years previous in hopes of making this transition as seamless as possible for the stakeholders.

"Our revised program is designed to continue with many of the annual deadlines and obligations of clubs as the IDNR already had in place," Willey said. "We want to change the program operations as little as possible, operating the program very closely to previous procedures and requirements."

#### **Agreement Delayed by Equipment Transfer**

The ISSA notified the IDNR last fall that its members would be lobbying for these significant changes when the Iowa Legislature convened in January. At that time, Assistant IDNR Director Bruce Trautman said the agency would remain "neutral" on the proposal and would work with whatever changes came about.

When it came time to draft the new cooperative agreement this summer, Fowler said "it was a pretty easy process to get both sides in agreement with the language, requirements and roles of each party." As of late August, however, the agreement had yet to be signed as the transfer of some of the grooming equipment was delaying the process.

Sixteen units are currently tied to federal grant money, and as of



press time, the IDNR was awaiting further guidance from the Iowa Department of Transportation (IDOT) on how to proceed with those units before signing the agreement.

"Both parties want all of the equipment transferred with one agreement," Fowler explained. "It's taking a little bit longer than we would like. We want to get this signed as soon as possible. From our perspective and the ISSA, it's a done deal. We just have to get this last piece okayed."

The IDOT is involved because that agency administers the Federal Highway Administration's Recreational Trail Grant Program (RTP) in Iowa. For the better part of 15 years now, the IDNR and the ISSA has relied on this federal match for the purchase of grooming equipment. Funding for the program is generated by the federal fuel taxes collected on off-road vehicles.

Historically, the state snowmobile program requests \$240,000 annually from the RTP. By design, the state snowmobile program has to finance the purchases up front and then wait to get reimbursed through the federal grant process on the back end. The IDOT's trails advisory committee determines how much is awarded to the various user groups, and the ISSA is represented on that board.

The application deadline for the next round of RTP funding is in October. Depending on the grant award, Willey indicated no new groomers will be purchased this year as RSC members work to purchase two units coming off lease.

"Those two units will be staying in those clubs," Willey said. "As soon as we can get the next round of RTP set in place, the first thing that will occur is getting those two off lease."

#### **EFC to Manage Books**

The ISSA's trail grant account will be managed by the ISSA's Emergency Funding and Legislation Committee (EFC). This group drafted the proposal to increase the percentage of the program receipts for the local side and worked closely with Heller and fellow ISSA Lobbyist Paula Feltner on getting the legislation passed earlier this year.

The ISSA's portion of the registration dollars will be delivered by the IDNR quarterly, and an independent firm will audit the account annually. Clubs will submit their reimbursement requests and grant applications to the ISSA at the end of each season, and snowmobile owners will continue to title and register their sleds through electronic licensing agents and at county recorder offices.

"Initially, there's going to be a small amount of back and forth with the money for federal grant purposes; but other than that, we will transfer 70 percent of all of the revenue that's received, and it will then be the ISSA's job to manage it," Fowler said.

The ISSA created the EFC in 2002 following the Iowa Legislature's unprecedented depletion of snowmobile program reserves. Close to \$950,000 in snowmobile registration receipts at that time were de-obligated to cover budget shortfalls elsewhere in the state. Through intense lobbying efforts, the funds were eventually restored five years later.

Since then, the EFC has used that momentum to successfully secure additional changes to the state snowmobile program, including an annual registration period in lieu of a biennial system and the creation of a user permit (trail pass) to increase trail grant

It's important to note that other measures have fallen short over the years, however, including gas tax reimbursement three years ago and, this year, the merger of the optional trail pass into the annual registration fee.

According to EFC member and Past ISSA President Jim Willey, the combined decal—which had been outlined in the ISSA's 2017 legislative package—became a casualty in the negotiations for the increased percentages. The ISSA's recommendation to allow single-ski, motorized snow bikes on public Turn to page 20



Professional Series to Return to Sundown Mountain this March

Professional snocross racing action will return to eastern Iowa in March following the successful debut of the series in the Hawkeye State earlier this year at Sundown Mountain Resort near Dubuque.

Anticipating 4,000 spectators, the inaugural Theisen's National Snocross event March 3-4 drew an estimated 5,300 fans from the tri-state area to the downhill ski run. The popularity of the weekend prompted resort management to sign up for two more years.

As the seventh of eight stops on the Amsoil Championship Series circuit, the 2018 race at Dubuque will be held a week later on March 9-10; and based on feedback from race teams and spectators, promoters are already looking for ways to improve the experience for all parties involved.

"We are going to be changing the course up a little bit to make it even better," reported Mark Gordon, general manager at Sundown. "I felt we did a pretty good job last year, but I know there are going to be a couple of things we need to fix for next year. We are really going to work on better seating and provide the racers more space and better opportunities for exciting action."

Gordon admits the hairpin turn at the bottom of the track at last March's event was "not popular" with the riders, and he is working with officials from the race's sanctioning body, the International Series of Champions (ISOC), to create a "teardrop" shaped loop in that area instead.

The starting line will also likely be relocated to the bottom of the course so additional bleachers can be placed next to the lodge to increase seating capacity. According to Gordon, chairlifts could also be running to provide a "unique viewing experience" for spectators during the race, and controlled access inside the bottom half of the track may be offered as well.

"We know several people walked down to the lower section just on their own last year and saw some good racing action," Gordon said. "Next year, we are going to encourage that location and provide security to keep everyone safe. We'll have a spot reserved for them, and it should offer a neat perspective."

As with last March, downhill ski operations will be shut down for race weekend, and the resort will once again rely on shuttle bus routes to bring spectators to the venue. Parking is limited at the resort with team haulers filling the main parking areas and support vehicles and VIPs occupying nearby lots.

"One of the biggest challenges coming into the weekend was parking, and in all honesty, I thought we did a pretty good job with it," Gordon said. "Given our challenges, I thought everything went well with off-site parking and our shuttle bus system."

#### **Profiles from the Pits**

Situated near the entrance to the resort at last season's race was the Ingles Performance team of brothers Leo and Hunter Patenaude from Hartland, Vt. This Ski-Doo factory-backed duo competes in the Pro-Lite and Sport class, respectively, and

crew chief.

Also participating in the East Coast Snocross (ECS) circuit closer to home, both are considered rising stars in the sport with each achieving varying levels of success on the track. Two weekends before Dubuque, Leo, 21, won the ECS Pro Open Final at Bennington, Vt., and Hunter, 18, finished the 2016-17 campaign with the ACS Sport class points championship.

For this coming season, Hunter is moving up to join his brother in the Pro Lite division. Pro Lite is a step below the Pro Open class, and according to Leo, the racing doesn't get any easier the further up the ranks they climb. For his efforts last season, Leo competed in 12 of the 16 ACS races in that class and finished 23rd in points.

"Competition in the Pro Lite class is very tough," he said from inside his race trailer at Dubuque. "There are a ton of guys who can win on any given weekend. We are all very fast and in good shape to win. It's not easy out there, that's for sure."

Racing on two circuits, the Patenaude brothers spend a majority of their time on the road, living out of hotel rooms and campers most of the time. Racing since he was eight years old, the elder brother admits to occasionally getting homesick but hopes the sacrifice will eventually pay off for him down the road.

"I want to get better every week and I'm motivated to win," Leo said. "I've been fortunate to have success over the last few years. This year is a little tougher as I'm competing against faster guys, but we're improving each week. We're always looking to get to

that next level. It's going to take work and better equipment."

#### **Racing Downhill Not Uncommon**

Sundown was the second of three downhill ski resorts the national series visited last year. The season opened at a ski run in Duluth in November and ended two weeks after Dubuque at a resort near Lake Geneva, Wis. Patenaude said ski runs offer different race conditions than the flatter tracks like Canterbury Park in Shakopee, Minn.

"On a flat track, you use your brakes more, whereas on a ski run, you don't want to use them too much going downhill because it will bring your back end up and you can go for a ride," he said. "It takes a lot of knowledge and experience out there on the track."

Patenaude admits he didn't think he'd ever be racing snocross in Iowa, but the stopover was worth it as the terrain and changing elevation of eastern Iowa was slightly reminiscent of his home state in Vermont. "It's been a nice experience over here with some great views," he said.

While his press release described the course as "rough, steep and tight," then-defending Pro Open series champion Tucker Hibbert of Pelican Rapids, Minn., said he enjoyed coming south to Iowa for a new track on the circuit last year. For his efforts at Dubuque, he finished fifth on Friday night and second Saturday night, ending the weekend third in the points race.

"I'm happy to get a podium finish in Iowa," Hibbert said at the time. "I struggled a little bit on Friday but felt better Saturday. I felt like I rode a good race Saturday night, working my way through the pack but came up short.

"It was exciting to see all the fans who came out to see the race," he continued. "It's always fun to go to a new venue and see the excitement of the fans. Everyone seemed really happy to have a race in the Dubuque area so hopefully it's an event that can continue."

Eventual Amsoil season points champion Kody Kamm of Kenosha, Wis., also struggled on Friday but rebounded on Saturday with a Pro Open Final win. His Hengtes Racing team also described the new locale as "one of the toughest downhill sections riders have ever seen, making it one of the most challenging races so far this season."

Team owner Nate Hentges said the new venue has potential. "I think the crowd was great, but they will need to improve the viewing area for the fans for next year," he said after race weekend. "I know the ski hill is already looking into a number of ways to improve the fan experience."

Polaris-backed Kamm described his performance on Saturday at Dubuque as "excellent" with "some bad luck" on Friday. His team left the weekend just 28 points outside of first place. At the final races of the season at Lake Geneva, Wis., two weeks later, he won





Kamm reached the podium 10 times with five wins, two seconds and three thirds.

"I had lot of ups and down this year. I separated my shoulder and thought I was done after that, but I won my first race back," Kamm said. "I felt great (racing at Lake Geneva); no shoulder pain at all. This is a dream come true."

Looking ahead, this season's race at Dubuque will once again have Dubuque-headquartered Theisen's back as a title sponsor. Gordon said promoters are soliciting associate sponsors for race weekend, and interested individuals can contact him at (515) 778-

The ISSA will also be looking for volunteers to work at the track race weekend. Last season, members provided parking assistance

organization and recruit new members with a booth at the main lodge. ISSA President Chris Willey said the experience was very worthwhile for the ISSA.

"The Amsoil snocross event at Dubuque has been a great addition to the Iowa snowmobile season," he said. "It has showcased our sport in a three-state area. The event gave us a chance to talk directly with snowmobilers of all ages who may not know what we do for them. I look forward to attending the event this coming year and hope to see everyone there."

# Website Offers Safety Education Resources, Training Materials

To help keep riders educated and safe. the website snowmobileinfo.org has an extensive collection of safety education resources, avalanche education and information, training manuals and other resources available for snowmobilers, the general public, snowmobile clubs, management agencies and land managers.



The website is a collaboration between

the American Council of Snowmobile Associations (ACSA), the U.S. Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and the International Snowmobiler Manufacturers Association (ISMA).

A main component of the safety resources page offers links to avalanche education providers and avalanche centers, providing up-to-the-minute weather reports, mountain and snow conditions and avalanche danger ratings.

"Snowmobile riding, especially in mountain regions, is an awesome way to see the grandeur of nature up close, but it is always important to remain vigilant about avalanches," said ISMA President Ed Klim. "The website offers links to avalanche centers worldwide, which provide current terrain and weather conditions imperative to the safety of snowmobilers."

The website also offers the Safe Riders! Safety Awareness Program, designed to educate riders on safe snowmobiling practices, including preparing for a ride, hand signals, common trail signs, roadway hazards, how to get unstuck and how to survive an emergency on the trail or backcountry.

Additional safety resources available at www.snowmobileinfo.org include links to state agencies and organizations that provide snowmobile safety training.

In 2016, ACSA and the FHWA extended their professional relationship with a new, five-year partnership to educate, unite and promote responsible snowmobiling in the U.S. For more information, visit www.snowmobileinfo.org.

snowmobile trails also fell by

the wayside.

"To get the legislation passed this year that increased our percentages, we had to give up with going with one sticker," Chris Willey pointed out. "This coming season you will still need two stickers to be legal to ride in Iowa. You still have to have the trail pass and the registration sticker."

#### **Not Giving Up on Single Decal**

The proposal for one decal was another measure aimed at increasing funding for the state snowmobile program. Currently, a registered sled and a user permit are required to ride on public trails and frozen rivers in Iowa. A snowmobiler who only rides his or her machine out of state is not required to obtain the trail pass.

Since the inception of the trail pass in 2013, the yearly trend shows that 75 percent of the registered sled owners in Iowa purchase the optional user permit. That ratio works out to approximately \$90,000 in lost revenue. By merging the trail permit with the sled registration for a total of \$30, the state snowmobile program could benefit financially.

Well documented in this publication last season, EFC members knew going into the 2017 legislative session that the single-decal measure would be an uphill battle in Des Moines, as snowmobilers in western and southern Iowa typically own mountain sleds and claim they do not ride in Iowa and therefore should not have to pay the extra \$15.

"In actuality, they don't want their registrations to go up to \$30," acknowledged Region 7 Director John Kahler. "They claim they don't ride in this state and only go out west."

The single-decal measure did pass the House last year but stalled in the Senate, where it remains eligible again for the 2018 legislative session. At the ISSA Board of Directors meeting in August, members voted to move forward with the proposal again this January.

"The proposed legislation is still eligible," Durby said. "The EFC felt it should be to the board's decision whether we move forward with it or not."

"I think it's a very small number of Iowans who register their snowmobiles here but don't ride in the state. For the most part, I think the majority of Iowa snowmobilers support the single sticker," Jim Willey said. "I think we have to do a good job now and through this fall to make sure all snowmobilers in Iowa understand why we need this money and why a single-sticker system works better. It provides more predictable income for our program."

"Going to a single sticker will be a challenge, but anything is possible with the right grass-roots efforts," Heller noted later.

"I think this will be a very tooth and nail struggle in the Senate," Chris Willey said. "There are snowmobilers in southern Iowa and western Iowa in particular who were very vocal to their legislators that they did not want this."

Besides the single decal and snow bike proposal, the ISSA had initially requested 80 percent of the total registration receipts be obligated to the local club side. The 10 percent difference was lost in the negotiations.


